banish	Send (someone) away from a country or place as an official punishment. <i>He was banished from his own country.</i>
communism	A political theory favoring collectivism in a classless society.
converse	Engage in conversation. <i>His converse at such seasons was always elevating.</i>
counteract	Oppose or check by a counteraction. <i>This will counteract the foolish actions of my colleagues.</i>
coup	An instance of successfully achieving something difficult. <i>He was overthrown in an army coup.</i>
crusader	A person who campaigns vigorously for political, social, or religious change; a campaigner. <i>Crusaders for early detection and treatment of mental illnesses.</i>
defeat	An instance of defeating or being defeated. <i>This line of reasoning defeats me I must confess.</i>
depose	Testify to or give (evidence) under oath, typically in a written statement. <i>Every affidavit shall state which of the facts deposed to are within the deponent s knowledge.</i>
destabilize	Become unstable. <i>The accused were charged with conspiracy to destabilize the country.</i>
diametrical	Characterized by opposite extremes; completely opposed. <i>Diametrical or opposite points of view.</i>
enfeeble	Make weak. <i>Sickness had enfeebled me.</i>
fend	Look after and provide for oneself, without any help from others. <i>The youngsters had to fend for themselves after their parents died.</i>
french	United States sculptor who created the seated marble figure of Abraham Lincoln in the Lincoln Memorial in Washington D.C. (1850-1931).

junta	A group of military officers who rule a country after seizing power. <i>The country s ruling military junta.</i>
outbreak	A sudden occurrence of something unwelcome, such as war or disease. <i>The outbreak of hostilities.</i>
overthrow	A score made because the ball has been overthrown. <i>Military coups which had attempted to overthrow the King.</i>
overturn	An act of overturning something. <i>The big vase overturned.</i>
reversal	A change from one state to the opposite state. <i>A reversal by the House of Lords of the Court of Appeal s decision.</i>
reverse	Reverse the position order relation or condition of. <i>He didn t feel homesick quite the reverse.</i>
revolt	Refuse to acknowledge someone or something as having authority. <i>A revolt over tax increases.</i>
revolution	A single complete turn (axial or orbital). <i>Marketing underwent a revolution.</i>
revolutionary	Of or relating to or characteristic or causing an axial or orbital turn. <i>The revolutionary army.</i>
revolutionize	Overthrow by a revolution, of governments. <i>E mail revolutionized communication in academe.</i>
setback	A reversal or check in progress. <i>They had to get permission to overlap the city s setback lines.</i>
spin	Cause to spin. <i>They spin wool into the yarn for weaving.</i>
takeover	An act of assuming control of something, especially the buying out of one company by another. <i>A company threatened with takeover.</i>
turn	To break and turn over earth especially with a plow. <i>He turned up the collar of his coat.</i>
undermine	Hollow out as if making a cave or opening. <i>The demolition engineers did eventually undermine two of the tower s six sides.</i>
upset	The act of upsetting something. <i>He upset a tureen of soup.</i>
usurp	Take (a position of power or importance) illegally or by force. <i>He usurped my rights.</i>
