<b>banish</b>	Send (someone) away from a country or place as an official punishment. <i>He was <b>banished</b> from his own country.</i>
<b>communism</b>	A political theory favoring collectivism in a classless society.
<b>converse</b>	Engage in conversation. <i>His <b>converse</b> at such seasons was always elevating.</i>
<b>counteract</b>	Oppose or check by a counteraction. <i>This will <b>counteract</b> the foolish actions of my colleagues.</i>
<b>coup</b>	An instance of successfully achieving something difficult. <i>He was overthrown in an army <b>coup</b>.</i>
<b>crusader</b>	A person who campaigns vigorously for political, social, or religious change; a campaigner. <i><b>Crusaders</b> for early detection and treatment of mental illnesses.</i>
<b>defeat</b>	An instance of defeating or being defeated. <i>This line of reasoning <b>defeats</b> me I must confess.</i>
<b>depose</b>	Testify to or give (evidence) under oath, typically in a written statement. <i>Every affidavit shall state which of the facts <b>deposed</b> to are within the deponent s knowledge.</i>
<b>destabilize</b>	Become unstable. <i>The accused were charged with conspiracy to <b>destabilize</b> the country.</i>
<b>diametrical</b>	Characterized by opposite extremes; completely opposed. <i><b>Diametrical</b> or opposite points of view.</i>
<b>enfeeble</b>	Make weak. <i>Sickness had <b>enfeebled</b> me.</i>
<b>fend</b>	Look after and provide for oneself, without any help from others. <i>The youngsters had to <b>fend</b> for themselves after their parents died.</i>
<b>french</b>	United States sculptor who created the seated marble figure of Abraham Lincoln in the Lincoln Memorial in Washington D.C. (1850-1931).

<b>junta</b>	A group of military officers who rule a country after seizing power. <i>The country s ruling military <b>junta</b>.</i>
<b>outbreak</b>	A sudden occurrence of something unwelcome, such as war or disease. <i>The <b>outbreak</b> of hostilities.</i>
<b>overthrow</b>	A score made because the ball has been overthrown. <i>Military coups which had attempted to <b>overthrow</b> the King.</i>
<b>overturn</b>	An act of overturning something. <i>The big vase <b>overturned</b>.</i>
<b>reversal</b>	A change from one state to the opposite state. <i>A <b>reversal</b> by the House of Lords of the Court of Appeal s decision.</i>
<b>reverse</b>	Reverse the position order relation or condition of. <i>He didn t feel homesick quite the <b>reverse</b>.</i>
<b>revolt</b>	Refuse to acknowledge someone or something as having authority. <i>A <b>revolt</b> over tax increases.</i>
<b>revolution</b>	A single complete turn (axial or orbital). <i>Marketing underwent a <b>revolution</b>.</i>
<b>revolutionary</b>	Of or relating to or characteristic or causing an axial or orbital turn. <i>The <b>revolutionary</b> army.</i>
<b>revolutionize</b>	Overthrow by a revolution, of governments. <i>E mail <b>revolutionized</b> communication in academe.</i>
<b>setback</b>	A reversal or check in progress. <i>They had to get permission to overlap the city s <b>setback</b> lines.</i>
<b>spin</b>	Cause to spin. <i>They <b>spin</b> wool into the yarn for weaving.</i>
<b>takeover</b>	An act of assuming control of something, especially the buying out of one company by another. <i>A company threatened with <b>takeover</b>.</i>
<b>turn</b>	To break and turn over earth especially with a plow. <i>He <b>turned</b> up the collar of his coat.</i>
<b>undermine</b>	Hollow out as if making a cave or opening. <i>The demolition engineers did eventually <b>undermine</b> two of the tower s six sides.</i>
<b>upset</b>	The act of upsetting something. <i>He <b>upset</b> a tureen of soup.</i>
<b>usurp</b>	Take (a position of power or importance) illegally or by force. <i>He <b>usurped</b> my rights.</i>
