<b>continuous</b>	Continuing in time or space without interruption- James Jeans. <i>Lived in <b>continuous</b> fear.</i>
<b>following</b>	Immediately following in time or order. <i>Tried to outrun the <b>following</b> footsteps.</i>
<b>in a row</b>	Holding office.
<b>in succession</b>	Currently fashionable.
<b>running</b>	Done while running. <i>In <b>running</b> or working order.</i>
<b>sequent</b>	Following in a sequence or as a logical conclusion. <i>The period of tension and <b>consequent</b> need for military preparedness.</i>

- sequential** Forming or following in a logical order or sequence.  
***Sequential** processing of data files.*
- serial** Pertaining to or composed in serial technique.  
*A **serial** publication.*
- solid** Of good quality and condition solidly built.  
*A **solid** base hit.*
- straight** Simple straightforward.  
*He gave her a **straight** no nonsense look.*
- succeeding** Coming after or following.  
*Over the **succeeding** decades recording equipment got cheaper.*
- unbroken** Marked by continuous or uninterrupted extension in space or time or sequence.  
***Unbroken** land.*
- uninterrupted** Having undisturbed continuity.  
*The window gives an **uninterrupted** view of the mountains.*

<b>alphabetical</b>	In the order of the letters of the alphabet. <i>An <b>alphabetical</b> index.</i>
<b>cession</b>	The formal giving up of rights, property, or territory by a state. <i>The <b>cession</b> of twenty important towns.</i>
<b>concatenate</b>	Add by linking or joining so as to form a chain or series. <i><b>Concatenate</b> characters.</i>
<b><u>consecutive</u></b>	In a consecutive manner. <i>A <b>consecutive</b> pattern of what the film would be like.</i>
<b>constant</b>	Steadfast in purpose or devotion or affection. <i>A <b>constant</b> friend.</i>

<b><u>continual</u></b>	Continual meaning seemingly uninterrupted is often used interchangeably with continuous meaning without interruption. <i><b>Continual</b> is often used interchangeably with continuous.</i>
<b><u>continuation</u></b>	The act of continuing an activity without interruption. <i>The <b>continuation</b> of discussions about a permanent peace.</i>
<b>continuity</b>	The unbroken and consistent existence or operation of something over time. <i>They have provided the country with a measure of <b>continuity</b>.</i>
<b>continuous</b>	(of a function) of which the graph is a smooth unbroken curve, i.e. one such that as the value of x approaches any given value a, the value of f(x) approaches that of f(a) as a limit. <i>A <b>continuous</b> rearrangement of electrons in the solar atoms results in the emission of light.</i>
<b><u>episode</u></b>	A section between two choric songs in Greek tragedy. <i>Acute psychotic <b>episodes</b>.</i>
<b>homologous</b>	(of chromosomes) pairing at meiosis and having the same structural features and pattern of genes. <i>A seal s flipper is <b>homologous</b> with the human arm.</i>
<b>incessant</b>	(of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption. <i>The <b>incessant</b> beat of the music.</i>
<b>interlocking</b>	The act of interlocking or meshing. <i>A design of <b>interlocking</b> leaves.</i>
<b><u>nonstop</u></b>	Occurring without stops. <i>A <b>nonstop</b> flight to Atlanta.</i>
<b>ordered</b>	Having a systematic arrangement; especially having elements succeeding in order according to rule. <i>An <b>ordered</b> sequence.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	Occurring repeatedly; so frequent as to seem endless and uninterrupted. <i>Hell s <b>perpetual</b> fires.</i>
<b><u>repetitive</u></b>	Repetitive and persistent. <i>A <b>repetitive</b> task.</i>
<b>row</b>	The act of rowing as a sport. <i><b>Rows</b> of barbed wire protected the trenches.</i>
<b>sequel</b>	A published, broadcast, or recorded work that continues the story or develops the theme of an earlier one. <i>The Prisoner of Zenda and its <b>sequel</b>.</i>

<b>sequence</b>	Arrange in a sequence. <i>Trainee librarians decide how a set of misfiled cards could be <b>sequenced</b>.</i>
<b>sequential</b>	Performed or used in sequence. <i>A series of <b>sequential</b> steps.</i>
<b>serial</b>	A serialized set of programs. <i>He was a <b>serial</b> adulterer.</i>
<b>seriatim</b>	In a series; one after another. <i>It is proposed to deal with these matters <b>seriatim</b>.</i>
<b>series</b>	A serialized set of programs. <i>A <b>series</b> III SWB Land Rover.</i>
<b>streak</b>	Cover a surface with streaks. <i>Had a <b>streak</b> of bad luck.</i>
<b>subsequence</b>	Following in time. <i>An affair which appeared in due <b>subsequence</b> in the newspapers.</i>
<b>succession</b>	A number of people or things of a similar kind following one after the other. <i>A <b>succession</b> of failures.</i>
<b>successively</b>	Immediately one after another. <i>He served <b>successively</b> as a major and a lieutenant colonel.</i>
<b>unceasing</b>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>The <b>unceasing</b> efforts of the staff.</i>
<b>uninterrupted</b>	(of a view) unobstructed. <i>The window gives an <b>uninterrupted</b> view of the mountains.</i>
