
Succulent as an Adjective

- Tender and full of juice.
- (of food) tender, juicy, and tasty.

ripe (of fruit or grain) developed to the point of readiness for harvesting and eating.

A population **ripe** with discontent.

soft Used chiefly as a direction or description in music soft in a quiet subdued tone.

They are \tilde{soft} on crime.

tender Hurting.

The pale **tender** skin of her forearm.

marmalade A preserve made of the pulp and rind of citrus fruits.
