## Associations of "Succumbed" (30 Words)

<b>abjure</b>	Solemnly renounce (a belief, cause, or claim. <i>MPs were urged to <b>abjure</b> their Jacobite allegiance.</i>
<b>analgesia</b>	The inability to feel pain. <i>She was able to take <b>analgesia</b> orally.</i>
<b>bowed</b>	Forming or resembling an arch.
<b>capitulate</b>	Cease to resist an opponent or an unwelcome demand; yield. <i>The patriots had to <b>capitulate</b> to the enemy forces.</i>
<b>cede</b>	Give up (power or territory). <i>In 1874 the islands were <b>ceded</b> to Britain.</i>
<b>concession</b>	The right, given by a company, to sell goods, especially in a particular place. <i>New logging <b>concessions</b>.</i>
<b>condescend</b>	Treat condescendingly. <i>Take care not to <b>condescend</b> to your reader.</i>
<b>condescension</b>	The trait of displaying arrogance by patronizing those considered inferior. <i>I m treated with <b>condescension</b>.</i>
<b>crouch</b>	A crouching stance or posture. <i>He <b>crouched</b> down.</i>
<b>disease</b>	A disorder of structure or function in a human, animal, or plant, especially one that produces specific symptoms or that affects a specific location and is not simply a direct result of physical injury. <i>Bacterial meningitis is quite a rare <b>disease</b>.</i>
<b>generate</b>	Produce (energy). <i>The computer <b>generated</b> this image.</i>
<b>grant</b>	A right or privilege that has been granted. <i>They will <b>grant</b> you asylum.</i>

<b><u>illness</u></b>	A disease or period of sickness affecting the body or mind. <i>He died after a long <b>illness</b>.</i>
<b>injunction</b>	A formal command or admonition. <i><b>Injunction</b> were formerly obtained by writ but now by a judicial order.</i>
<b>kneel</b>	Rest one's weight on one's knees. <i>In church you have to <b>kneel</b> during parts of the service.</i>
<b><u>obedience</u></b>	Observance of a monastic rule. <i><b>Obedience</b> to moral standards.</i>
<b><u>obey</u></b>	Be obedient to. <i>The universe was complex but it <b>obeyed</b> certain rules.</i>
<b>relinquish</b>	Turn away from; give up. <i>I am <b>relinquishing</b> my bedroom to the long term house guest.</i>
<b>resignation</b>	An act of resigning from a job or office. <i>I ve handed in my <b>resignation</b>.</i>
<b>servile</b>	Of or characteristic of a slave or slaves. <i>Brown s attempt at <b>servile</b> insurrection.</i>
<b>slavish</b>	Servile or submissive. <i>A <b>slavish</b> yes man to the party bosses.</i>
<b>stoop</b>	Bend one's head or body forwards and downwards. <i>The rocks <b>stooped</b> down over the hiking path.</i>
<b>submission</b>	The condition of having submitted to control by someone or something else. <i>A written <b>submission</b> to the UN.</i>
<b>submissive</b>	Abjectly submissive characteristic of a slave or servant S H Adams. <i><b>Submissive</b> servants.</i>
<b><u>submit</u></b>	Hand over formally. <i>The United States refused to <b>submit</b> to arbitration.</i>
<b>subservience</b>	Abject or cringing submissiveness. <i>All his actions were in <b>subservience</b> to the general plan.</i>
<b><u>subservient</u></b>	Serving or acting as a means or aid. <i>The whole narration is <b>subservient</b> to the moral plan of exemplifying twelve virtues in twelve knights.</i>
<b><u>surrender</u></b>	The action of surrendering to an opponent or powerful influence. <i>The UK is opposed to <b>surrendering</b> its monetary sovereignty.</i>

**ultimatum**

A final demand or statement of terms, the rejection of which will result in retaliation or a breakdown in relations.

*Their employers issued an **ultimatum** demanding an immediate return to work.*

**yield**

Be willing to concede.

*He **yielded** to the demands of his partners.*
