### **Definitions of "Sufficient" as an adjective**

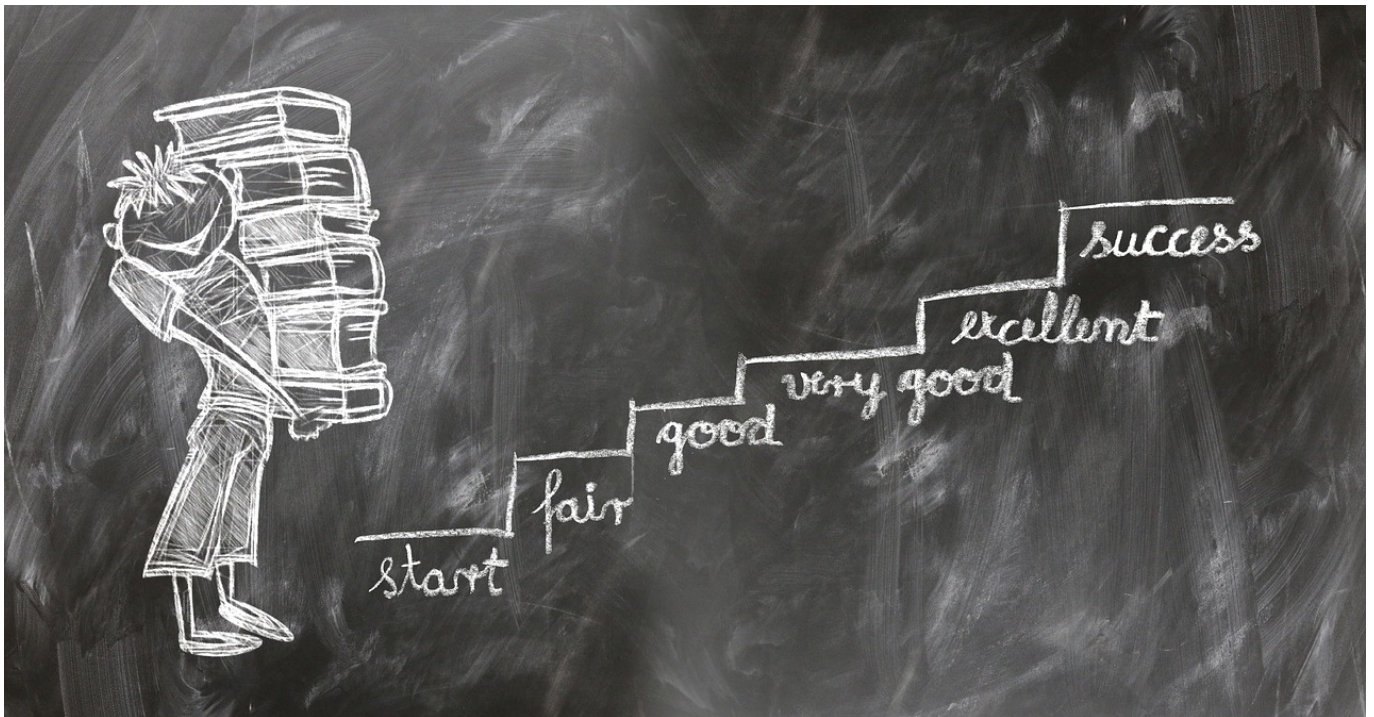
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “sufficient” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Enough; adequate.*
- *Of a quantity that can fulfill a need or requirement but without being abundant.*



## Synonyms of "Sufficient" as an adjective (4 Words)

- abundant** Having plenty of.  
*There was **abundant** evidence to support the theory.*
- adequate** About average; acceptable.  
*More than **adequate** as a secretary.*
- ample** Fairly large.  
*An **ample** supply.*
- enough** Sufficient for the purpose.  
***Enough** food.*



## Usage Examples of "Sufficient" as an adjective

- *They had sufficient resources to survive.*
- *Sufficient food.*
- *She had a small private income that was sufficient for her needs.*
- *We have sufficient reason for supposing this to be the case.*





## Associations of "Sufficient" (30 Words)

- abundant** Present in great quantity.  
*The riverbanks were **abundant** in beautiful wild plants.*
- abundantly** In an abundant manner.  
*They were **abundantly** supplied with food.*
- adequacy** The quality of being sufficient for the end in view.  
*The **adequacy** of testing procedures.*
- adequate** Having the requisite qualities or resources to meet a task.  
*An **adequate** income.*
- amazing** Surprising greatly.  
*An **amazing** number of people registered.*
- ample** Enough or more than enough; plentiful.  
*There is **ample** time for discussion.*
- amply** To an ample degree or in an ample manner.  
*These voices were **amply** represented.*
- bountiful** Producing in abundance.  
*This **bountiful** God has thought of everything.*
- copious** Profuse in speech or ideas.  
*I had been a little too **copious** in talking of my country.*

<b>copiously</b>	In large quantities. <i>I was drinking <b>copiously</b>.</i>
<b>enough</b>	An adequate quantity a quantity that is large enough to achieve a purpose. <i>Curiously <b>enough</b> this is not a new phenomenon.</i>
<b>entire</b>	Constituting the undiminished entirety lacking nothing essential especially not damaged. <i>An ideological system with which he is in <b>entire</b> agreement.</i>
<b>equipped</b>	Provided with whatever is necessary for a purpose (as furniture or equipment or authority). <i>A ship <b>equipped</b> with every mechanical aid to navigation.</i>
<b>exceeding</b>	Extremely exceedingly. <i>A night of <b>exceeding</b> darkness.</i>
<b>exceptional</b>	Unusual; not typical. <i><b>Exceptional</b> kindness.</i>
<b>full</b>	Gather or pleat fabric so as to make a garment full. <i>She turned her head and looked <b>full</b> into his face.</i>
<b>fully</b>	Referring to a quantity. <i><b>Fully</b> 65 per cent of all funerals are by cremation.</i>
<b>large</b>	A garment size for a large person. <i>The concert attracted <b>large</b> crowds.</i>
<b>plentiful</b>	Producing in abundance. <i>Food is <b>plentiful</b>.</i>
<b>plentitude</b>	A full supply.
<b>prodigious</b>	Far beyond what is usual in magnitude or degree. <i>Her memory was <b>prodigious</b>.</i>
<b>profuse</b>	(especially of something offered or discharged) very plentiful; abundant. <i>They are <b>profuse</b> in hospitality.</i>
<b>replete</b>	Filled to satisfaction with food or drink. <i>It is <b>replete</b> with misery.</i>
<b>sizable</b>	Fairly large. <i>A <b>sizable</b> fortune.</i>
<b>spacious</b>	Having ample space. <i>A <b>spacious</b> ballroom.</i>
<b>suffice</b>	Be sufficient; be adequate, either in quality or quantity. <i>Two examples should <b>suffice</b> to prove the contention.</i>

- sufficiency** Self sufficiency or independence of character especially of an arrogant or imperious sort.  
*A **sufficiency** of good food.*
- surpassing** Exceeding or surpassing usual limits especially in excellence.  
*A picture of **surpassing** beauty.*
- vast** An immense space.  
*The **vast** accumulation of knowledge which we call civilization.*
- voluminous** (of writing) very lengthy and detailed.  
*A subject of **voluminous** legislation.*
