- *Worthy of being chosen especially as a spouse.*



## Synonyms of "Suitable" as an adjective (30 Words)

<b>able</b>	Having considerable skill proficiency or intelligence. <i>A <b>capable</b> administrator.</i>
<b>acceptable</b>	Meeting requirements. <i>The electoral arrangements must be <b>acceptable</b> to the people.</i>
<b>appropriate</b>	Suitable for a particular person or place or condition etc. <i>This isn't the <b>appropriate</b> time or place.</i>
<b>appropriate to</b>	Suitable for a particular person or place or condition etc.
<b>apt</b>	Quick to learn. <i>He is <b>apt</b> to ignore matters he considers unimportant.</i>
<b>becoming</b>	According with custom or propriety. <i>Do not talk too much to your cousins it's not <b>becoming</b>.</i>
<b>befitting</b>	Appropriate to the occasion. <i>Behavior <b>befitting</b> a father.</i>

<b>capable</b>	Able to achieve efficiently whatever one has to do; competent. <i>A passage <b>capable</b> of misinterpretation.</i>
<b>competent</b>	Adequate for the purpose. <i>The London Stock Exchange is the <b>competent</b> authority under the Financial Services Act.</i>
<b>congruous with</b>	Suitable or appropriate together.
<b>correct</b>	Socially right or correct. <i>He was a polite man invariably <b>correct</b> and pleasant with Mrs Collins.</i>
<b>custom-made</b>	Made according to the specifications of an individual.
<b>decent</b>	Decently clothed. <i>Though one of her shoulder straps had slipped down she was perfectly <b>decent</b> by current standards.</i>
<b>decorous</b>	According with custom or propriety. <i>The tete a tete was <b>decorous</b> in the extreme.</i>
<b>desirable</b>	Worth having or seeking or achieving. <i>A <b>desirable</b> outcome.</i>
<b>due</b>	(of a thing) required or owed as a legal or moral obligation. <i>Talks are <b>due</b> to adjourn tomorrow.</i>
<b>fit</b>	(usually followed by `to' or `for') on the point of or strongly disposed. <i>A <b>fit</b> subject for discussion.</i>
<b>fitted</b>	Of a room equipped with matching units of fitted furniture. <i>A <b>fitted</b> kitchen.</i>
<b>fitting</b>	Being precisely fitting and right. <i>Loose <b>fitting</b> trousers.</i>
<b>in character with</b>	Directed or bound inward.
<b>in keeping with</b>	Directed or bound inward.
<b>proper</b>	Denoting something that is truly what it is said or regarded to be; genuine. <i>To judge with my <b>proper</b> eyes.</i>
<b>right</b>	Socially right or correct. <i>The <b>right</b> answer.</i>
<b>satisfactory</b>	(of a patient in a hospital) not deteriorating or likely to die. <i><b>Satisfactory</b> living conditions.</i>
<b>seemly</b>	According with custom or propriety. <i>I felt it was not <b>seemly</b> to observe too closely.</i>
<b>suited</b>	Outfitted or supplied with clothing. <i>Recruits <b>suited</b> in green.</i>



<b>tailor-made</b>	Custom-made.
<b>well qualified</b>	Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.
<b>well suited</b>	In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.
<b>worthy</b>	Worthy of being chosen especially as a spouse. A <b>worthy</b> cause.



### Usage Examples of "Suitable" as an adjective

- *The parents found the girl suitable for their son.*
- *These toys are not suitable for children under five.*
- *A tractor suitable (or fit) for heavy duty.*



## Associations of "Suitable" (30 Words)

<b>acceptable</b>	Judged to be in conformity with approved usage. <i>An <b>acceptable</b> substitute for champagne.</i>
<b>adequacy</b>	The state or quality of being adequate. <i>He questioned the <b>adequacy</b> of the usual sentimental interpretation of the Golden Rule.</i>
<b>adequate</b>	Satisfactory or acceptable in quality or quantity. <i><b>Adequate</b> resources and funding.</i>
<b>affordable</b>	That you have the financial means for. <i><b>Affordable</b> homes.</i>
<b>aligning</b>	Causing to fall into line or into position.
<b>ample</b>	(of a person's figure) full or broad. <i>There is <b>ample</b> time for discussion.</i>
<b>appropriate</b>	Take (something) for one's own use, typically without the owner's permission. <i>It seems that an apology is <b>appropriate</b>.</i>
<b>compatibility</b>	A feeling of sympathy and friendship; like-mindedness. <i>They felt the bond of true <b>compatibility</b>.</i>
<b>compatible</b>	Capable of forming a homogeneous mixture that neither separates nor is altered by chemical interaction. <i>A <b>compatible</b> married couple.</i>

<b>conformable</b>	Quick to comply-Shakespeare. <i>I have been to you a true and humble wife at all times to your will <b>conformable</b>.</i>
<b>congruous</b>	In agreement or harmony. <i>This explanation is <b>congruous</b> with earlier observations.</i>
<b>decent</b>	Decently clothed. <i>A <b>decent</b> wage.</i>
<b>eligible</b>	(of a person) desirable or suitable as a partner in marriage. <i><b>Eligible</b> to run for office.</i>
<b>enough</b>	An adequate quantity a quantity that is large enough to achieve a purpose. <i>I can get there easily <b>enough</b>.</i>
<b>fit</b>	Be the right size or shape fit correctly or as desired. <i>Well are you <b>fit</b>.</i>
<b>germane</b>	Relevant and appropriate. <i>That is not <b>germane</b> to our theme.</i>
<b>harmonious</b>	Forming a pleasing or consistent whole. <i>The decor is a <b>harmonious</b> blend of traditional and modern.</i>
<b>identical</b>	Having properties with uniform values along all axes. <i>The passage on the second floor was <b>identical</b> to the one below.</i>
<b>inoffensive</b>	Substituting a mild term for a harsher or distasteful one. <i>A quiet <b>inoffensive</b> man.</i>
<b>moderation</b>	The avoidance of excess or extremes, especially in one's behaviour or political opinions. <i>He urged the police to show <b>moderation</b>.</i>
<b>proper</b>	Satisfactorily or correctly. <i><b>Proper</b> manners.</i>
<b>properly</b>	In the right manner; correctly; suitably. <i>Ensuring the work is carried out <b>properly</b>.</i>
<b>propriety</b>	The condition of being right, appropriate, or fitting. <i>He always behaved with the utmost <b>propriety</b>.</i>
<b>relevancy</b>	The relation of something to the matter at hand.
<b>relevant</b>	Having a bearing on or connection with the subject at issue. <i>Her films are <b>relevant</b> for feminists today.</i>
<b>sufficiency</b>	Self sufficiency or independence of character especially of an arrogant or imperious sort. <i>He questioned the <b>sufficiency</b> of human intelligence.</i>

<b>suitability</b>	The quality of being right or appropriate for a particular person, purpose, or situation. <i>Her superiors had doubts about her <b>suitability</b> for the job.</i>
<b>symphonic</b>	(of music) relating to or having the form or character of a symphony. <i>The <b>symphonic</b> hum of a million insects.</i>
<b>unobjectionable</b>	Free from objectionable elements; fit for all observers. <i>The bail conditions were <b>unobjectionable</b> as far as he was concerned.</i>
<b>validation</b>	The action of checking or proving the validity or accuracy of something. <i>The technique requires <b>validation</b> in controlled trials.</i>
