Definitions of "Suitcase" as a noun

- *A portable rectangular container for carrying clothes.*

- travel bag** The act of going from one place to another.
- traveling bag** The act of going from one place to another.
- travelling bag** A movement through space that changes the location of something.
- valise** A small travelling bag or suitcase.
- vanity case** The trait of being unduly vain and conceited; false pride.

case	An agreed summary of the facts relating to a legal case drawn up for review or decision on a point of law by a higher court. <i>The accusative case.</i>
checked	Having a pattern of small squares. <i>A checked shirt.</i>
checkered	Marked by changeable fortune. <i>A checkered business career.</i>
contain	Be capable of holding or containing. <i>Since F contains the factor Q it disappears from both sides of the equation.</i>
crate	The quantity contained in a crate. <i>Fruit and vegetables were being sorted and crated.</i>
knapsack	A bag carried by a strap on your back or shoulder.
luggage	Cases used to carry belongings when traveling. <i>Carrying emotional luggage from the past.</i>
pack	Load with a pack. <i>Every summer they are backpacking in the Rockies.</i>
package	A package holiday. <i>The singer is being packaged to appeal to teenagers.</i>
packet	Make up into or wrap up in a packet. <i>One man was fined 25 for dropping a crisp packet from his car window.</i>
packing	A charge made when delivering goods to cover the cost of packing them. <i>She finished her packing.</i>
paperback	Having a flexible binding. <i>The shelves were stacked with well thumbed paperbacks.</i>
patterned	Having patterns (especially colorful patterns). <i>Traditional rose patterned wallpaper isn't difficult to find.</i>
pocket	Of a suitable size for carrying in a pocket. <i>They were prepared to pocket their pride.</i>
portmanteau	A large travelling bag, typically made of stiff leather and opening into two equal parts. <i>Brunch is a well known portmanteau.</i>
pouch	Make part of a garment hang like a pouch. <i>Webbing with pouches for stun grenades.</i>
purse	A sum of money spoken of as the contents of a money purse. <i>Marianne took a glance at her reflection and pursed her lips disgustingly.</i>
sack	Put into a sack or sacks. <i>He got the sack for swearing.</i>

stow	Fill by packing tightly. <i>Stow the cart.</i>
traveling	The act of going from one place to another.
<u>unpack</u>	Remove (something) from a suitcase, bag, or package. <i>We unpacked the sandwiches.</i>
wallet	A pocket-sized flat folding case for holding money and plastic cards.
wrapper	The covering (usually paper or cellophane) in which something is wrapped. <i>Cellophane wrappers.</i>
