According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "suite" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- A musical composition of several movements only loosely connected.
- Apartment consisting of a series of connected rooms used as a living unit (as in a hotel.
- A group of minerals, rocks, or fossils occurring together and characteristic of a location or period.
- A set of rooms designated for one person's or family's use or for a particular purpose.
- A set of coordinating furniture.
- A set of selected pieces from an opera or musical, arranged to be played as one instrumental work.
- A set of programs with a uniform design and the ability to share data.
- A matching set of furniture.
- The group following and attending to some important person.
- A group of people in attendance on a monarch or other person of high rank.
- A set of instrumental compositions, originally in dance style, to be played in succession.

suite of rooms A matching set of furniture.

A series of connected railway carriages or wagons moved by a

locomotive or by integral motors.


The bride s **train** was carried by her two young nephews.

machine.

restroom A toilet in a public building.

A set of rooms typically rented in which a person couple or family live.

Hardly enough elbow **room** to turn around.

shower Take a shower wash one s body in the shower.

They installed a **shower** in the bathroom.

soap A soap opera.

She **soap**ed her face.

stool Grow shoots in the form of stools or tillers.
