- admirer** A person who has a particular regard for someone or something.
*She s got a secret **admirer**.*
- beau** A rich, fashionable young man; a dandy.
- boyfriend** A man who is the lover of a girl or young woman.
*If I d known he was her **boyfriend** I wouldn t have asked.*
- inamorato** A man with whom you are in love or have an intimate relationship.
*Her days were spent dallying with her **inamorato**.*
- lover** A partner in a sexual or romantic relationship outside marriage.
*He was a great **lover** of cats.*
- suer** Someone who petitions a court for redress of a grievance or recovery of a right.
*A **suer** for the hand of the princess.*
- sweetheart** Any well-liked individual.
*Don t worry **sweetheart** I ve got it all worked out.*
- wooer** A man who courts a woman.



Usage Examples of "Suitor" as a noun

- *She decided to marry her suitor.*
- *The company agreed to negotiate with its suitor.*

bigamist

Someone who marries one person while already legally married to another.

bigamy

The offense of marrying someone while you have a living spouse from whom no valid divorce has occurred.

bridal

Of or relating to a wedding.
***Bridal** procession.*

bride	A woman participant in her own marriage ceremony. <i>The bride and groom left early last night.</i>
cohabit	Share living quarters; usually said of people who are not married and live together as a couple. <i>Mary is now cohabiting with Paul.</i>
conjoin	Take in marriage. <i>An approach which conjoins theory and method.</i>
consummate	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i>The property sale is consummated.</i>
couple	A pair of partners in a dance or game. <i>The engaged couple.</i>
dowry	Money or property brought by a woman to her husband at marriage. <i>Elizabeth s dowry was to be 45 000 in diamonds.</i>
endogamy	Marriage within one's own tribe or group as required by custom or law.
fiance	A man who is engaged to be married.
groom	A bridegroom. <i>The horses were groomed and taken to shows.</i>
honeymoon	Spend a honeymoon. <i>The new President s honeymoon period.</i>
husband	Use cautiously and frugally. <i>She husbanded their financial resources through difficult times.</i>
marital	Relating to marriage or the relations between a married couple. <i>She wanted to talk about their marital problems.</i>
marriage	The state of being married. <i>His second marriage was happier than the first.</i>
married	A person who is married. <i>Married bliss.</i>
marry	(of a parent or guardian) give (a son or daughter) in marriage. <i>They had no plans to marry.</i>
matrimony	The ceremony or sacrament of marriage. <i>The joys of matrimony.</i>
newlywed	Someone recently married.
partner	Associate or work together as partners. <i>We ve partnered with several venues and organizations to bring fun science events to the city.</i>
polygamist	An animal that has more than one mate. <i>A Mississippi based group of practising polygamists.</i>

polygamy	A pattern of mating in which an animal has more than one mate.
prenuptial	Relating to events before a marriage. Prenuptial pregnancy.
<u>propose</u>	Propose or intend. <i>I have already proposed to Sarah.</i>
<u>spouse</u>	A husband or wife, considered in relation to their partner.
wed	Take in marriage. <i>We were wed the following week.</i>
wedding	A party of people at a wedding.
<u>wife</u>	The wife of a person with a specified occupation. <i>He and his wife are keen gardeners.</i>
