**suer** right.


A **suer** for the hand of the princess.

Money or property brought by a woman to her husband at marriage.

Elizabeth s **dowry** was to be 45 000 in diamonds.

**endogamy** Marriage within one's own tribe or group as required by custom or law.

**fiance** A man who is engaged to be married.

A bridegroom.

The horses were **groom**ed and taken to shows.

**honeymoon** Spend a honeymoon.

The new President's **honeymoon** period.

husband Use cautiously and frugally.

She **husband**ed their financial resources through difficult times.

Relating to marriage or the relations between a married couple.

She wanted to talk about their **marital** problems.

marriage The state of being married.

His second **marriage** was happier than the first.

. A person who is married.

married Married bliss.

marry

(of a parent or guardian) give (a son or daughter) in marriage.

They had no plans to marry.

**matrimony** The ceremony or sacrament of marriage. *The joys of matrimony.* 

**newlywed** Someone recently married.

Associate or work together as partners.

<u>partner</u> We ve **partner**ed with several venues and organizations to bring fun science

events to the city.

polygamist A Mississippi h and a group of proceedings.

A Mississippi based group of practising **polygamist**s.



**polygamy** A pattern of mating in which an animal has more than one mate.

**prenuptial** Relating to events before a marriage.

**Prenuptial** pregnancy.

**propose** Propose or intend.

I have already **propose**d to Sarah.

**spouse** A husband or wife, considered in relation to their partner.

Take in marriage.

wed We were wed the following week.

**wedding** A party of people at a wedding.

The wife of a person with a specified occupation.

He and his **wife** are keen gardeners.
