- *A man who courts a woman.*

- admirer** A person who has a particular regard for someone or something.  
*She s got a secret **admirer**.*
- beau** A rich, fashionable young man; a dandy.
- boyfriend** A man who is the lover of a girl or young woman.  
*If I d known he was her **boyfriend** I wouldn t have asked.*
- inamorato** A man with whom you are in love or have an intimate relationship.  
*Her days were spent dallying with her **inamorato**.*
- lover** A partner in a sexual or romantic relationship outside marriage.  
*He was a great **lover** of cats.*
- suer** Someone who petitions a court for redress of a grievance or recovery of a right.  
*A **suer** for the hand of the princess.*
- sweetheart** Any well-liked individual.  
*Don t worry **sweetheart** I ve got it all worked out.*
- wooer** A man who courts a woman.



## Usage Examples of "Suitor" as a noun

- *She decided to marry her suitor.*
- *The company agreed to negotiate with its suitor.*

### [bachelor](#)

Lead a bachelor's existence.  
*One of the country's most eligible **bachelors**.*

### **bigamist**

Someone who marries one person while already legally married to another.

### **bigamy**

The offense of marrying someone while you have a living spouse from whom no valid divorce has occurred.

### **bridal**

Of or relating to a wedding.  
***Bridal** procession.*

<b>bride</b>	A woman participant in her own marriage ceremony. <i>The <b>bride</b> and groom left early last night.</i>
<b>cohabit</b>	Share living quarters; usually said of people who are not married and live together as a couple. <i>Mary is now <b>cohabiting</b> with Paul.</i>
<b>conjoin</b>	Take in marriage. <i>An approach which <b>conjoins</b> theory and method.</i>
<b>consummate</b>	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i>The property sale is <b>consummated</b>.</i>
<b>couple</b>	A pair of partners in a dance or game. <i>The engaged <b>couple</b>.</i>
<b>dowry</b>	Money or property brought by a woman to her husband at marriage. <i>Elizabeth s <b>dowry</b> was to be 45 000 in diamonds.</i>
<b>endogamy</b>	Marriage within one's own tribe or group as required by custom or law.
<b>fiance</b>	A man who is engaged to be married.
<b>groom</b>	A bridegroom. <i>The horses were <b>groomed</b> and taken to shows.</i>
<b>honeymoon</b>	Spend a honeymoon. <i>The new President s <b>honeymoon</b> period.</i>
<b>husband</b>	Use cautiously and frugally. <i>She <b>husbanded</b> their financial resources through difficult times.</i>
<b>marital</b>	Relating to marriage or the relations between a married couple. <i>She wanted to talk about their <b>marital</b> problems.</i>
<b>marriage</b>	The state of being married. <i>His second <b>marriage</b> was happier than the first.</i>
<b>married</b>	A person who is married. <i><b>Married</b> bliss.</i>
<b>marry</b>	(of a parent or guardian) give (a son or daughter) in marriage. <i>They had no plans to <b>marry</b>.</i>
<b>matrimony</b>	The ceremony or sacrament of marriage. <i>The joys of <b>matrimony</b>.</i>
<b>newlywed</b>	Someone recently married.
<b>partner</b>	Associate or work together as partners. <i>We ve <b>partnered</b> with several venues and organizations to bring fun science events to the city.</i>
<b>polygamist</b>	An animal that has more than one mate. <i>A Mississippi based group of practising <b>polygamists</b>.</i>

<b>polygamy</b>	A pattern of mating in which an animal has more than one mate.
<b>prenuptial</b>	Relating to events before a marriage. <b>Prenuptial</b> pregnancy.
<u><b>propose</b></u>	Propose or intend. <i>I have already <b>proposed</b> to Sarah.</i>
<u><b>spouse</b></u>	A husband or wife, considered in relation to their partner.
<b>wed</b>	Take in marriage. <i>We were <b>wed</b> the following week.</i>
<b>wedding</b>	A party of people at a wedding.
<u><b>wife</b></u>	The wife of a person with a specified occupation. <i>He and his <b>wife</b> are keen gardeners.</i>
