ascend	(of a voice or sound) rise in pitch. <i>She ascended the stairs.</i>
ascending	Moving or going or growing upward. <i>Blood pressure in the ascending aorta.</i>
ascent	An instance of rising or moving up through the air. <i>His ascent to power.</i>
boost	Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>Boost the voltage in an electrical circuit.</i>
climb	An ascent especially of a mountain or hill by climbing. <i>An above average climb in prices.</i>
climbing	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i>His other great interest was climbing especially in the Alps.</i>
elevate	Raise the axis of (a piece of artillery) to increase its range. <i>He has elevated bad taste into an art form.</i>
elevator	A muscle whose contraction raises a part of the body. <i>Elevators of the upper lip.</i>
escalator	A clause in a contract that provides for an increase or a decrease in wages or prices or benefits etc. depending on certain conditions (as a change in the cost of living index).
high	A high power setting. <i>High summer.</i>
hoist	Raise (something) by means of ropes and pulleys. <i>Hoist a sail.</i>
ladder	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>One of Sally s stockings developed a ladder.</i>
lift	An act of lifting. <i>Thomas s eyelids drowsily lifted.</i>

mounting	The action of mounting something. <i>He pulled the curtain rail from its mounting.</i>
precipitate	A substance precipitated from a solution. <i>Vesuvius precipitated its fiery destructive rage on Herculaneum.</i>
promote	Of an additive act as a promoter of a catalyst. <i>I got promoted after many years of hard work.</i>
raise	Raise from a lower to a higher position. <i>His flag was raised over the city.</i>
rise	Rise in rank or status. <i>Rise to a challenge.</i>
risen	(of e.g. celestial bodies) above the horizon. <i>The risen sun.</i>
rising	Going up, increasing, or sloping upward. <i>The rising fives on the verge of school.</i>
scale	Measure with or as if with scales. <i>A spray on chemical for removing welding scale and heat discoloration from stainless steel.</i>
soar	Fly or rise high in the air. <i>The bird spread its wings and soared into the air.</i>
soaring	The activity of flying a glider. <i>The soaring spires of the cathedral.</i>
stairs	A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.
stepladder	A folding portable ladder hinged at the top.
uphill	Sloping upward. <i>An uphill struggle to gain worldwide recognition.</i>
upstairs	With respect to the mind. <i>No one was allowed to see the upstairs.</i>
upward	Extending or moving toward a higher place. <i>A general upward movement of fish.</i>
vertically	In a vertical direction. <i>Vertically stacked books.</i>
zoom	Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out. <i>Bikes zoomed past.</i>
