<b>ascend</b>	(of a voice or sound) rise in pitch. <i>She <b>ascended</b> the stairs.</i>
<b>ascending</b>	Moving or going or growing upward. <i>Blood pressure in the <b>ascending</b> aorta.</i>
<b>ascent</b>	An instance of rising or moving up through the air. <i>His <b>ascent</b> to power.</i>
<b>boost</b>	Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i><b>Boost</b> the voltage in an electrical circuit.</i>
<a href="#"><b>climb</b></a>	An ascent especially of a mountain or hill by climbing. <i>An above average <b>climb</b> in prices.</i>
<a href="#"><b>climbing</b></a>	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i>His other great interest was <b>climbing</b> especially in the Alps.</i>
<a href="#"><b>elevate</b></a>	Raise the axis of (a piece of artillery) to increase its range. <i>He has <b>elevated</b> bad taste into an art form.</i>
<b>elevator</b>	A muscle whose contraction raises a part of the body. <i><b>Elevators</b> of the upper lip.</i>
<b>escalator</b>	A clause in a contract that provides for an increase or a decrease in wages or prices or benefits etc. depending on certain conditions (as a change in the cost of living index).
<b>high</b>	A high power setting. <i><b>High</b> summer.</i>
<a href="#"><b>hoist</b></a>	Raise (something) by means of ropes and pulleys. <i><b>Hoist</b> a sail.</i>
<b>ladder</b>	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>One of Sally s stockings developed a <b>ladder</b>.</i>
<b>lift</b>	An act of lifting. <i>Thomas s eyelids drowsily <b>lifted</b>.</i>

<b>mounting</b>	The action of mounting something. <i>He pulled the curtain rail from its <b>mounting</b>.</i>
<b>precipitate</b>	A substance precipitated from a solution. <i>Vesuvius <b>precipitated</b> its fiery destructive rage on Herculaneum.</i>
<b>promote</b>	Of an additive act as a promoter of a catalyst. <i>I got <b>promoted</b> after many years of hard work.</i>
<b>raise</b>	Raise from a lower to a higher position. <i>His flag was <b>raised</b> over the city.</i>
<b>rise</b>	Rise in rank or status. <i><b>Rise</b> to a challenge.</i>
<b>risen</b>	(of e.g. celestial bodies) above the horizon. <i>The <b>risen</b> sun.</i>
<b>rising</b>	Going up, increasing, or sloping upward. <i>The <b>rising</b> fives on the verge of school.</i>
<b>scale</b>	Measure with or as if with scales. <i>A spray on chemical for removing welding <b>scale</b> and heat discoloration from stainless steel.</i>
<b>soar</b>	Fly or rise high in the air. <i>The bird spread its wings and <b>soared</b> into the air.</i>
<b>soaring</b>	The activity of flying a glider. <i>The <b>soaring</b> spires of the cathedral.</i>
<b>stairs</b>	A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.
<b>stepladder</b>	A folding portable ladder hinged at the top.
<b>uphill</b>	Sloping upward. <i>An <b>uphill</b> struggle to gain worldwide recognition.</i>
<b>upstairs</b>	With respect to the mind. <i>No one was allowed to see the <b>upstairs</b>.</i>
<b>upward</b>	Extending or moving toward a higher place. <i>A general <b>upward</b> movement of fish.</i>
<b>vertically</b>	In a vertical direction. <i><b>Vertically</b> stacked books.</i>
<b>zoom</b>	Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out. <i>Bikes <b>zoomed</b> past.</i>
