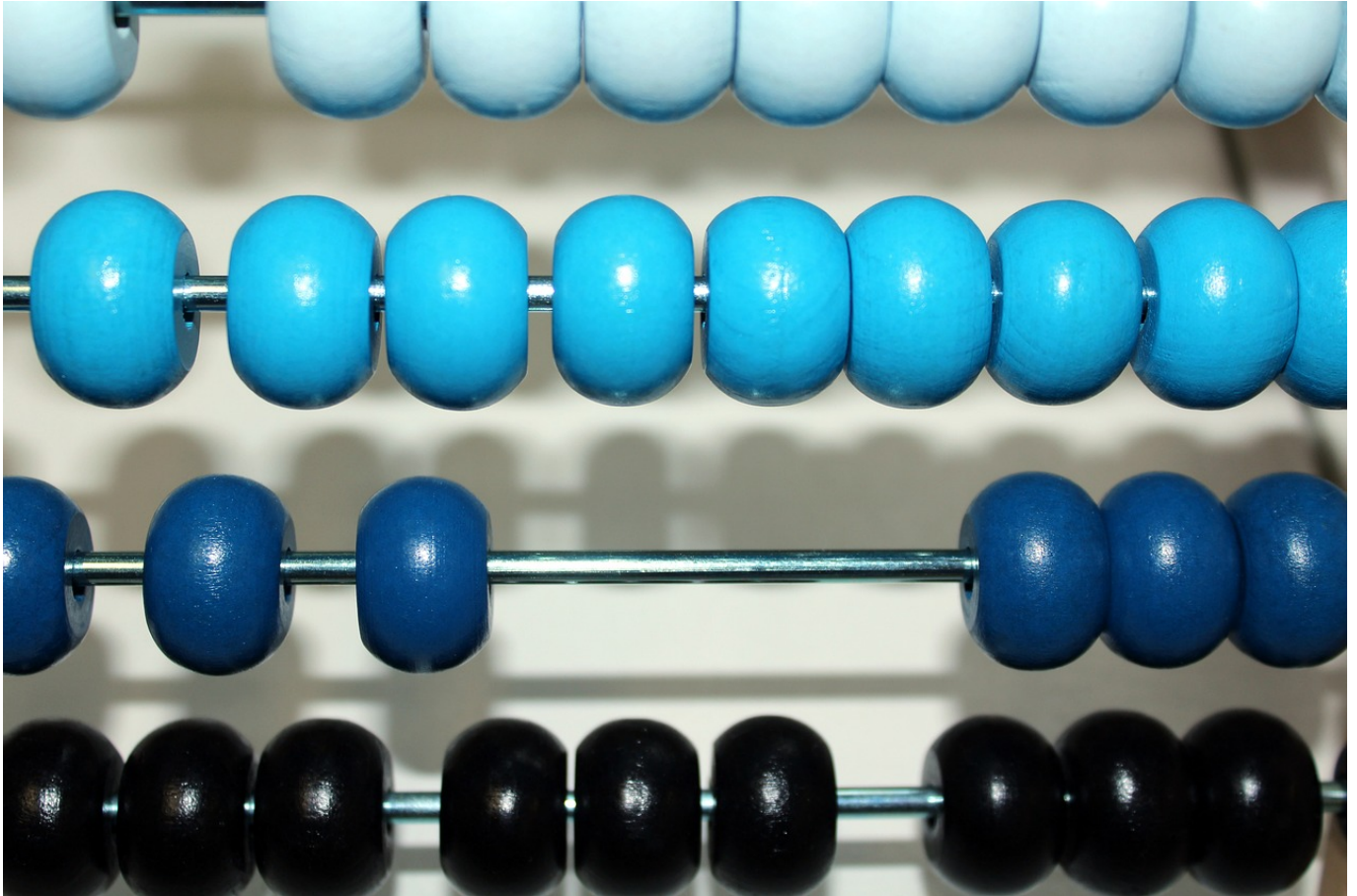

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “summation” as a noun can have the following definitions:

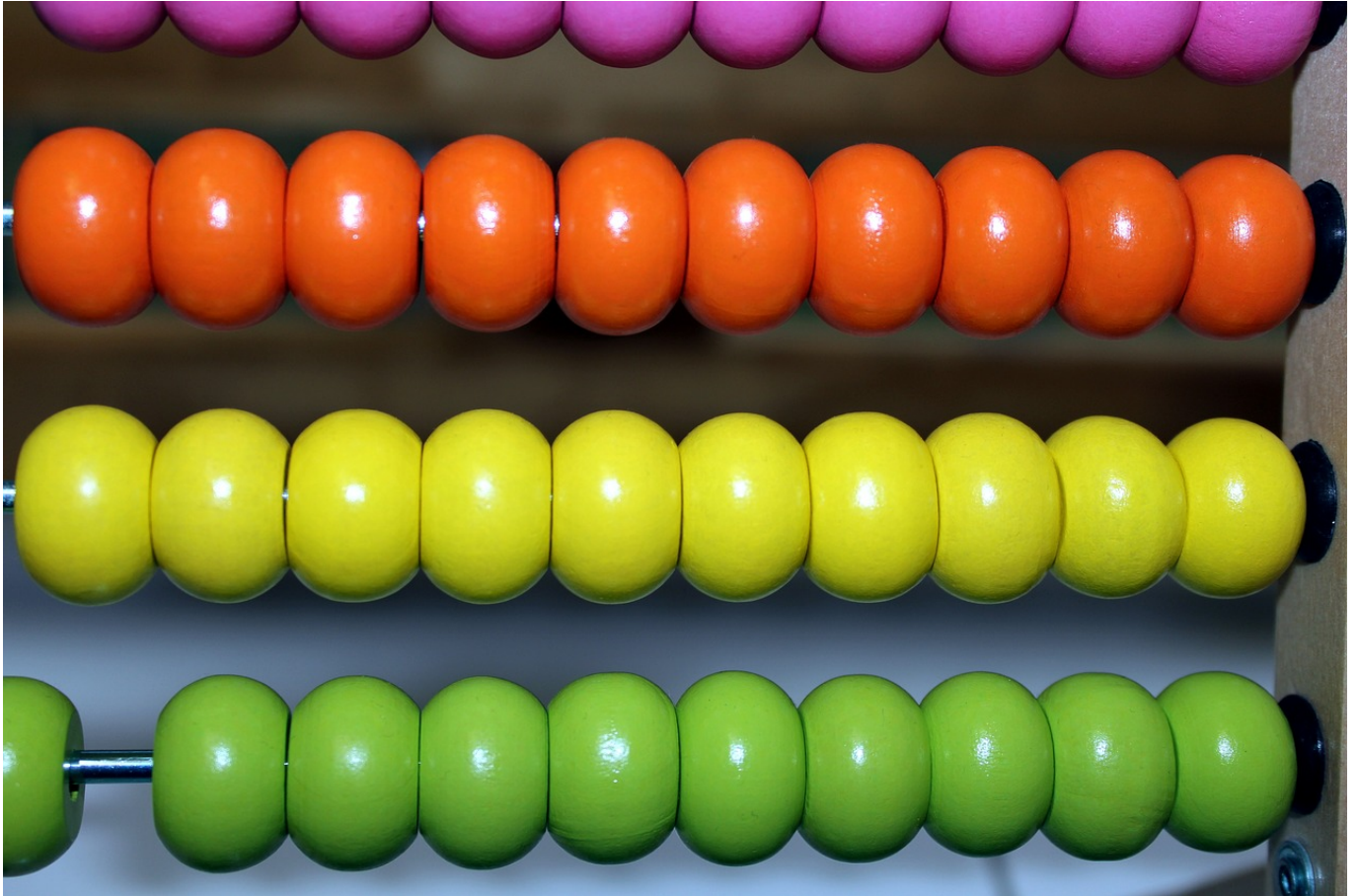
- *The process whereby multiple stimuli can produce a response (in a muscle or nerve or other part) that one stimulus alone does not produce.*
- *A summary.*
- *The arithmetic operation of summing; calculating the sum of two or more numbers.*
- *The process of adding things together.*
- *The process of summing something up.*
- *A sum total of things added together.*
- *The final aggregate.*
- *A concluding summary (as in presenting a case before a law court.*
- *(physiology) the process whereby multiple stimuli can produce a response (in a muscle or nerve or other part) that one stimulus alone does not produce.*

<u>abstract</u>	An abstract work of art. <i>An abstract of her speech.</i>
addition	The process of combining matrices, vectors, or other quantities under specific rules to obtain their sum or resultant. <i>The hotel has been extended with the addition of more rooms.</i>
<u>aggregate</u>	Pieces of broken or crushed stone or gravel used to make concrete and in building. <i>The result put the sides level on aggregate.</i>
alpha and omega	The basic meaning of something; the crucial part.
be-all and end-all	The essential factor; the all-important element; the supreme aim.
beginning and end	The place where something begins, where it springs into being.
entirety	The state of being total and complete. <i>He read the article in its entirety.</i>

final decision	The final match between the winners of all previous matches in an elimination tournament.
final statement	An examination administered at the end of an academic term.
grand total	The cardinal number that is the product of 10 and 100.
gross	A gross profit or income. <i>The box office grosses mounted.</i>
outline	A representation of a word in shorthand. <i>The chalked outline of a human body.</i>
<u>plus</u>	The arithmetic operation of summing; calculating the sum of two or more numbers. <i>A minus and a plus make another minus.</i>
precis	A summary or abstract of a text or speech.
<u>rundown</u>	An analysis or summary of something by a knowledgeable person. <i>A rundown in the business would be a devastating blow to the local economy.</i>
<u>sum</u>	A particular amount of money. <i>Do your sums then the shock will not be too great.</i>
sum total	The whole amount.
summarization	The act of preparing a summary (or an instance thereof); stating briefly and succinctly.
summary	A brief statement that presents the main points in a concise form. <i>He gave a summary of the conclusions.</i>
summing up	A quantity of money.
<u>synopsis</u>	A sketchy summary of the main points of an argument or theory. <i>A synopsis of the insurance cover provided is set out below.</i>
<u>tally</u>	An account kept by means of a tally. <i>I kept a tally of David's debt on a note above my desk.</i>
<u>total</u>	The whole amount. <i>He scored a total of thirty three points.</i>
<u>totality</u>	The whole of something. <i>Appalled by the totality of the destruction.</i>
<u>whole</u>	An assemblage of parts that is regarded as a single entity. <i>How big is that part compared to the whole.</i>



Usage Examples of "Summation" as a noun

- *The summation of numbers of small pieces of evidence.*
- *Their value is no mere summation of the values of their component parts.*
- *Two summations of his work were published.*
- *These will need summation in a single document.*
- *The summation of four and three gives seven.*

accessory A small article or item of clothing carried or worn to complement a garment or outfit.

*Functionally the maxillae are a pair of **accessory** jaws.*

add Make an addition by combining numbers.

*A new wing was **added** to the building.*

addition	A person or thing added or joined. <i>The concepts of vectors and vector addition.</i>
additional	Further or added. <i>Called for additional troops.</i>
additionally	In addition, by way of addition; furthermore. <i>Additionally 50 hours of practical experience will be necessary.</i>
additive	Characterized or produced by addition. <i>The combination of these factors has an additive effect.</i>
adjunct	A person who is another's assistant or subordinate. <i>A talented adjunct desperately grabbing at officer status.</i>
dispensable	Able to be replaced or done without; superfluous. <i>Dispensable items of personal property.</i>
except	Take exception to. <i>Five classes of advertisement are excepted from control.</i>
excess	Excessive indulgence. <i>Bouts of alcoholic excess.</i>
extra	Excessive or extravagant. <i>Found some extra change lying on the dresser.</i>
extraneous	Not belonging to that in which it is contained; introduced from an outside source. <i>Extraneous light in the camera spoiled the photograph.</i>
helping	A quantity of something. <i>It s a powerful ballad tinged with a huge helping of gospel vibes.</i>
padding	Artifact consisting of soft or resilient material used to fill or give shape or protect or add comfort. <i>Avoid waffle or padding in your essay.</i>
plethora	A large or excessive amount of something. <i>A plethora of committees and subcommittees.</i>
plus	(before a number) above zero; positive. <i>A minus and a plus make another minus.</i>
redundance	The attribute of being superfluous and unneeded.
rundown	A reduction in the productivity or activities of a company or institution. <i>A rundown in the business would be a devastating blow to the local economy.</i>
spare	Thin and fit. <i>The wheel s broken and it would be suicide to go on without a spare.</i>

subsidiary	Functioning in a supporting capacity. <i>All the firm's subsidiary companies have to operate under broad general guidelines.</i>
superabundance	A quantity that is more than what is appropriate.
supererogatory	More than is needed, desired, or required. <i>It was supererogatory of her to gloat.</i>
superfluity	An unnecessary thing. <i>They thought the garrison a superfluity.</i>
superfluous	Unnecessary, especially through being more than enough. <i>The purchaser should avoid asking for superfluous information.</i>
supernumerary	A supernumerary person or thing. <i>Extra ribs as well as other supernumerary internal parts.</i>
supplementary	A supplementary person or thing. <i>The programme offers supplementary information about the news.</i>
surfeit	Supply or feed to surfeit. <i>He died of a surfeit.</i>
surplus	More than what is needed or used; excess. <i>She had picked up her boots in an army surplus store.</i>
unmerited	Not merited. <i>Unmerited treatment of a potentially fine subject.</i>
unnecessary	Unnecessary things. <i>Some people feel that holiday insurance is unnecessary.</i>
