costly	Having a high price. <i>Costly jewelry.</i>
deluxe	Luxurious or sumptuous; of a superior kind. <i>A deluxe car.</i>
expensive	High in price or charging high prices. <i>An expensive bottle of wine.</i>
extravagant	Lacking restraint in spending money or using resources. <i>Extravagant gifts like computer games.</i>
gilded	Covered thinly with gold leaf or gold paint. <i>A painted and gilded wooden ceiling.</i>
gorgeous	Beautiful; very attractive. <i>The weather was gorgeous.</i>
grand	Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers. <i>She was such a grand lady.</i>

imposing	Impressive in appearance. <i>An imposing 17th century manor house.</i>
impressive	Evoking admiration through size, quality, or skill; grand, imposing, or awesome. <i>An impressive view of the mountains.</i>
lavish	Sumptuously rich, elaborate, or luxurious. <i>A lavish buffet.</i>
lush	Having strong sexual appeal. <i>Lush greenery and cultivated fields.</i>
luxurious	Extremely comfortable or elegant, especially when involving great expense. <i>Enjoyed a luxurious suite with a crystal chandelier and thick oriental rugs.</i>
magnificent	Extremely beautiful, elaborate, or impressive. <i>Magnificent cathedrals.</i>
opulent	Rich and superior in quality. <i>His more opulent tenants.</i>
palatial	Relating to or being a palace. <i>A palatial yacht.</i>
princely	(of a sum of money) large or generous (often used ironically). <i>The princely states of India.</i>
resplendent	Attractive and impressive through being richly colourful or sumptuous. <i>She was resplendent in a sea green dress.</i>
rich	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>A rich gas mixture.</i>
splendid	Very good; of the highest quality. <i>He was a splendid teacher.</i>

luxuriant	Displaying luxury and furnishing gratification to the senses. <i>She tossed her luxuriant dark hair.</i>
luxurious	Ostentatiously rich and superior in quality. <i>Enjoyed a luxurious suite with a crystal chandelier and thick oriental rugs.</i>
luxuriously	In a rich manner.
luxury	Luxurious or of the nature of a luxury. <i>He lived a life of luxury.</i>
millionaire	A person whose assets are worth one million pounds or dollars or more. <i>He is now a millionaire several times over.</i>
opulent	Rich and superior in quality. <i>His more opulent tenants.</i>
ornate	Elaborately or highly decorated. <i>Peculiarly ornate and metaphorical language.</i>
ostentation	The pretentious or showy display of wealth and luxury, designed to impress. <i>The office was spacious but without any trace of ostentation.</i>
ostentatious	Tawdry or vulgar. <i>A simple design that is glamorous without being ostentatious.</i>
palatial	Relating to or being a palace. <i>Her palatial apartment in Mayfair.</i>

patrimony	A church endowment. <i>Owners refuse to part with their patrimony in the interests of agricultural development.</i>
plenitude	An abundance. <i>The plenitude of the Pope's powers.</i>
plenteous	Plentiful. <i>A plenteous grape harvest.</i>
plentitude	A full supply.
prosper	Succeed in material terms; be financially successful. <i>God has wonderfully prospered this nation.</i>
prosperity	An economic state of growth with rising profits and full employment. <i>A long period of peace and prosperity.</i>
rich	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>A rich red.</i>
sybarite	A person addicted to luxury and pleasures of the senses.
upscale	Towards the more expensive or affluent sector of the market. <i>An upscale motel.</i>
voluptuary	A person addicted to luxury and pleasures of the senses. <i>A voluptuary decade when high living was in style.</i>
