## Superimposed as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Superimposed" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “superimposed” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *With one layer on top of another.*
- *Placed or laid over something else, typically so that both things are still evident.*
- *Placed on or over something else.*

### Synonyms of "Superimposed" as an adjective (2 Words)

**layered** (of a plant) propagated as a layer.  
*The current trend for **layered** clothes.*

**overlying** Placed on or over something else.  
*An **overlying** image.*

### Usage Examples of "Superimposed" as an adjective

- *Superimposed images of frantically swarming insects.*
- *Different stone tools were found in superimposed layers.*
- *Superimposed rocks.*

## Associations of "Superimposed" (30 Words)

<b>align</b>	Align oneself with a group or a way of thinking. <i>The fan blades are carefully <b>aligned</b>.</i>
<b>avenue</b>	A broad road in a town or city, typically having trees at regular intervals along its sides. <i>Three possible <b>avenues</b> of research suggested themselves.</i>
<b>boulevard</b>	A wide street or thoroughfare. <i>Sunset <b>Boulevard</b>.</i>
<b>busy</b>	Of facilities such as telephones or lavatories unavailable for use by anyone else or indicating unavailability engaged is a British term for a busy telephone line. <i>A <b>busy</b> seaport.</i>
<b>convergence</b>	The approach of an infinite series to a finite limit. <i>These bivalves have assumed similar characters by <b>convergence</b>.</i> (of thought) tending to follow only well-established patterns.
<b>convergent</b>	<i>One of the most bizarre examples of <b>convergent</b> evolution concerns the so called periodical cicadas.</i>
<b>crisscross</b>	Marked with crossing lines. <i>Wrinkles <b>crisscrossed</b> her face.</i>
<b>cross</b>	A cross as an emblem of Christianity. <i>Michele sat back and <b>crossed</b> her arms.</i>
<b>crossing</b>	The action of crossing something. <i>A short ferry <b>crossing</b>.</i>
<b>crossroad</b>	A junction where one street or road crosses another.
<b>crosswalk</b>	A path (often marked) where something (as a street or railroad) can be crossed to get from one side to the other.
<b>delineation</b>	A graphic or vivid verbal description. <i>The eventual <b>delineation</b> of the border between the two states.</i>
<b>heap</b>	Put objects or a loose substance in a heap. <i>A <b>heap</b> of cardboard boxes.</i>
<b>intersect</b>	Divide (something) by passing or lying across it. <i>Lines of latitude and longitude <b>intersect</b> at right angles.</i>
<b>intersection</b>	A representation of common ground between theories or phenomena. <i>His course is on a direct <b>intersection</b> with ours.</i>
<b>junction</b>	An act of joining or adjoining things. <i>The <b>junction</b> of two roundels produces a triangular space.</i>

<b><u>juxtapose</u></b>	Place or deal with close together for contrasting effect. <i>Black and white photos of slums were starkly <b>juxtaposed</b> with colour images.</i>
<b>laterally</b>	At, towards, or from the side or sides; sideways. <i>Think <b>laterally</b> about new ways of using limited resources.</i>
<b>lineation</b>	The line that appears to bound an object. <i>Magnetic <b>lineations</b>.</i>
<b>montage</b>	A sequence of film made using the technique of montage. <i>A <b>montage</b> of photographs.</i>
<b><u>overlap</u></b>	A part or amount which overlaps. <i>There are many <b>overlaps</b> between the approaches.</i>
<b><u>partially</u></b>	To some extent; in some degree; not wholly. <i>A <b>partially</b> open door.</i>
<b>pass</b>	Any authorization to pass or go somewhere. <i>South bids 1NT North <b>passes</b>.</i>
<b><u>pedestrian</u></b>	Lacking wit or imagination. <i>A <b>pedestrian</b> bridge.</i>
<b><u>portion</u></b>	Something determined in relation to something that includes it. <i>One end of the barn was <b>portioned</b> off for poultry.</i>
<b><u>road</u></b>	A railroad. <i>Clara had to walk in the <b>road</b> to avoid black plastic rubbish sacks.</i>
<b>roadway</b>	A road (especially that part of a road) over which vehicles travel.
<b><u>side</u></b>	The amount of writing needed to fill one side of a sheet of paper. <i>Whose <b>side</b> are you on.</i>
<b><u>street</u></b>	The streets of a city viewed as a depressed environment in which there is poverty and crime and prostitution and dereliction. <i>The narrow winding <b>streets</b> of Edinburgh.</i>
<b>thoroughfare</b>	A road or path forming a route between two places. <i>The middle bedroom is a <b>thoroughfare</b> to the bathroom.</i>
