- *Bending and moving easily and gracefully; flexible.*
- *Moving and bending with ease.*
- *Gracefully thin and bending and moving with ease.*
- *Not stiff or hard; easily manipulated.*
- *Capable of moving or bending freely.*

<b>acrobatic</b>	Performing, involving, or adept at spectacular gymnastic feats. <i>An <b>acrobatic</b> dive.</i>
<b>agile</b>	Able to move quickly and easily. <i>Sleek and <b>agile</b> as a gymnast.</i>
<b>bendable</b>	Capable of being bent or flexed or twisted without breaking.
<b>deft</b>	Neatly skilful and quick in one's movements. <i>A <b>deft</b> waiter.</i>
<b>elastic</b>	Capable of resuming original shape after stretching or compression; springy. <i>The labour supply is very <b>elastic</b>.</i>
<b>elegant</b>	(of a scientific theory or solution to a problem) pleasingly ingenious and simple. <i>An <b>elegant</b> mathematical solution simple and precise and lucid.</i>
<b>fit</b>	Meeting adequate standards for a purpose. <i>A <b>fit</b> subject on which to correspond.</i>
<b>flexible</b>	Capable of being changed. <i>A <b>flexible</b> personality.</i>
<b>graceful</b>	Suggesting taste, ease, and wealth. <i>She was a tall girl slender and <b>graceful</b>.</i>
<b>limber</b>	Capable of moving or bending freely. <i>I have to practise to keep myself <b>limber</b>.</i>
<b>lissom</b>	Moving and bending with ease. <i>The kind of outfit that should be left to <b>lissom</b> teenagers.</i>
<b>lissome</b>	Gracefully thin and bending and moving with ease.
<b>lithe</b>	Gracefully thin and bending and moving with ease. <i>She lay gazing up at his tall <b>lithe</b> figure.</i>
<b>lithesome</b>	Gracefully thin and bending and moving with ease.
<b>loose-jointed</b>	Loosely articulated or constructed.
<b>malleable</b>	Easily influenced. <i>A <b>malleable</b> metal can be beaten into a sheet.</i>
<b>nimble</b>	(of the mind) able to think and understand quickly. <i>As <b>nimble</b> as a deer.</i>
<b>plastic</b>	Made of plastic. <i><b>Plastic</b> bottles.</i>

<b><u>pliable</u></b>	Able to adjust readily to different conditions. <i>Quality leather is <b>pliable</b> and will not crack.</i>
<b>pliant</b>	Easily bent. <i><b>Pliant</b> molten glass.</i>
<b><u>resilient</u></b>	Recovering readily from adversity, depression, or the like. <i>As <b>resilient</b> as seasoned hickory.</i>
<b>rubbery</b>	Having a tough elastic texture, like that of rubber. <i>Portions of <b>rubbery</b> unseasoned canned spaghetti.</i>
<b>sinuous</b>	Having many curves and turns. <i>The <b>sinuous</b> grace of a cat.</i>
<b>soft</b>	Used chiefly as a direction or description in music soft in a quiet subdued tone. <i>The government is not becoming <b>soft</b> on crime.</i>
<b>springy</b>	Elastic; rebounds readily. <i>The <b>springy</b> turf.</i>
<b>stretchable</b>	Capable of being easily stretched and resuming former size or shape.
<b>stretchy</b>	(especially of material or a garment) able to stretch or be stretched easily. <i><b>Stretchy</b> miniskirts.</i>
<b>willowy</b>	(of a person) tall, slim, and lithe. <i><b>Willowy</b> meadow land.</i>
<b><u>workable</u></b>	Able to be worked, fashioned, or manipulated. <i>More flour and salt can be added until they make a <b>workable</b> dough.</i>
<b>yielding</b>	Inclined to yield to argument or influence or control. <i>A timid <b>yielding</b> person.</i>

<b>ductile</b>	Capable of being shaped or bent or drawn out. <i><b>Ductile</b> copper.</i>
<b>ductility</b>	The malleability of something that can be drawn into threads or wires or hammered into thin sheets.
<b>easy</b>	With ease easy is sometimes used informally for easily. <i>Just wanted to take it <b>easy</b>.</i>
<b>extended</b>	Fully extended or stretched forth. <i>The <b>extended</b> airport runways can accommodate larger planes.</i>
<b><u>flexible</u></b>	(of a person) ready and able to change so as to adapt to different circumstances. <i>Small businesses which are dependent on <b>flexible</b> working hours.</i>
<b>gangly</b>	Tall and thin and having long slender limbs.

<b>grace</b>	In Greek mythology three beautiful goddesses Aglaia Thalia and Euphrosyne believed to personify and bestow charm grace and beauty. <i>She has all the social <b>graces</b>.</i>
<b>graceful</b>	Suggesting taste, ease, and wealth. <i>She was a tall girl slender and <b>graceful</b>.</i>
<b>impressionable</b>	Easily impressed or influenced. <i>Children are highly <b>impressionable</b> and susceptible to advertising.</i>
<b>lank</b>	Of a person lanky. <i>The man had <b>lank</b> brown greasy hair.</i>
<b>limber</b>	Attach the limber. <i>A <b>limber</b> imagination.</i>
<b>lissom</b>	(of a person or their body) thin, supple, and graceful. <i>The kind of outfit that should be left to <b>lissom</b> teenagers.</i>
<b>lithe</b>	Moving and bending with ease. <i>She lay gazing up at his tall <b>lithe</b> figure.</i>
<b>malleability</b>	The property of being physically malleable; the property of something that can be worked or hammered or shaped without breaking.
<b>malleable</b>	(of a metal or other material) able to be hammered or pressed into shape without breaking or cracking. <i>A <b>malleable</b> metal can be beaten into a sheet.</i>
<b>plasticity</b>	The quality of being easily shaped or moulded. <i>Fine clay at the right degree of <b>plasticity</b> is more useful.</i>
<b>pliable</b>	Capable of being bent or flexed or twisted without breaking. <i><b>Pliable</b> teenage minds.</i>
<b>pliant</b>	Easily bent. <i>A more <b>pliant</b> prime minister.</i>
<b>silhouette</b>	Project on a background such as a screen like a silhouette. <i>The castle was <b>silhouetted</b> against the sky.</i>
<b>slender</b>	Being of delicate or slender build Frank Norris. <i><b>Slender</b> wages.</i>
<b>slim</b>	A course or period of slimming. <i>Restructuring and <b>slimming</b> down the organization.</i>
<b>sophisticated</b>	Appealing to or frequented by people who are sophisticated. <i>A <b>sophisticated</b> lifestyle.</i>
<b>stretch</b>	Easily stretched. <i>Small squares of canvas were <b>stretched</b> over the bamboo frame.</i>

<b><u>susceptible</u></b>	(of a person) easily influenced by feelings or emotions; sensitive. <i>They only do it to tease him he s too <b>susceptible</b>.</i>
<b>svelte</b>	Being of delicate or slender build. <i>She was <b>svelte</b> and sophisticated.</i>
<b><u>thin</u></b>	Make thin or thinner. <i>A <b>thin</b> sliced loaf.</i>
<b>urbane</b>	Showing a high degree of refinement and the assurance that comes from wide social experience. <i>The supposedly <b>urbane</b> restrained English gentleman.</i>
<b>waif</b>	A young person who is thin and looks unhealthy or uncared for. <i>A little shop presided over by a Gothic <b>waif</b> in purple eyeshadow and lipstick.</i>
<b>willowy</b>	Slender and graceful. <i><b>Willowy</b> meadow land.</i>
<b>yielding</b>	The act of conceding or yielding. <i>A gentle <b>yielding</b> person.</i>
