- *Bending and moving easily and gracefully; flexible.*
- *Moving and bending with ease.*
- *Gracefully thin and bending and moving with ease.*
- *Not stiff or hard; easily manipulated.*
- *Capable of moving or bending freely.*

acrobatic	Performing, involving, or adept at spectacular gymnastic feats. <i>An acrobatic dive.</i>
agile	Able to move quickly and easily. <i>Sleek and agile as a gymnast.</i>
bendable	Capable of being bent or flexed or twisted without breaking.
deft	Neatly skilful and quick in one's movements. <i>A deft waiter.</i>
elastic	Capable of resuming original shape after stretching or compression; springy. <i>The labour supply is very elastic.</i>
elegant	(of a scientific theory or solution to a problem) pleasingly ingenious and simple. <i>An elegant mathematical solution simple and precise and lucid.</i>
fit	Meeting adequate standards for a purpose. <i>A fit subject on which to correspond.</i>
flexible	Capable of being changed. <i>A flexible personality.</i>
graceful	Suggesting taste, ease, and wealth. <i>She was a tall girl slender and graceful.</i>
limber	Capable of moving or bending freely. <i>I have to practise to keep myself limber.</i>
lissom	Moving and bending with ease. <i>The kind of outfit that should be left to lissom teenagers.</i>
lissome	Gracefully thin and bending and moving with ease.
lithe	Gracefully thin and bending and moving with ease. <i>She lay gazing up at his tall lithe figure.</i>
lithesome	Gracefully thin and bending and moving with ease.
loose-jointed	Loosely articulated or constructed.
malleable	Easily influenced. <i>A malleable metal can be beaten into a sheet.</i>
nimble	(of the mind) able to think and understand quickly. <i>As nimble as a deer.</i>
plastic	Made of plastic. <i>Plastic bottles.</i>

<u>pliable</u>	Able to adjust readily to different conditions. <i>Quality leather is pliable and will not crack.</i>
pliant	Easily bent. <i>Pliant molten glass.</i>
<u>resilient</u>	Recovering readily from adversity, depression, or the like. <i>As resilient as seasoned hickory.</i>
rubbery	Having a tough elastic texture, like that of rubber. <i>Portions of rubbery unseasoned canned spaghetti.</i>
sinuous	Having many curves and turns. <i>The sinuous grace of a cat.</i>
soft	Used chiefly as a direction or description in music soft in a quiet subdued tone. <i>The government is not becoming soft on crime.</i>
springy	Elastic; rebounds readily. <i>The springy turf.</i>
stretchable	Capable of being easily stretched and resuming former size or shape.
stretchy	(especially of material or a garment) able to stretch or be stretched easily. <i>Stretchy miniskirts.</i>
willowy	(of a person) tall, slim, and lithe. <i>Willowy meadow land.</i>
<u>workable</u>	Able to be worked, fashioned, or manipulated. <i>More flour and salt can be added until they make a workable dough.</i>
yielding	Inclined to yield to argument or influence or control. <i>A timid yielding person.</i>

ductility	The malleability of something that can be drawn into threads or wires or hammered into thin sheets.
easy	With ease easy is sometimes used informally for easily. <i>Just wanted to take it easy.</i>
extended	Fully extended or stretched forth. <i>The extended airport runways can accommodate larger planes.</i>
<u>flexible</u>	(of a person) ready and able to change so as to adapt to different circumstances. <i>Small businesses which are dependent on flexible working hours.</i>
gangly	Tall and thin and having long slender limbs.

grace	In Greek mythology three beautiful goddesses Aglaia Thalia and Euphrosyne believed to personify and bestow charm grace and beauty. <i>She has all the social graces.</i>
graceful	Suggesting taste, ease, and wealth. <i>She was a tall girl slender and graceful.</i>
impressionable	Easily impressed or influenced. <i>Children are highly impressionable and susceptible to advertising.</i>
lank	Of a person lanky. <i>The man had lank brown greasy hair.</i>
limber	Attach the limber. <i>A limber imagination.</i>
lissom	(of a person or their body) thin, supple, and graceful. <i>The kind of outfit that should be left to lissom teenagers.</i>
lithe	Moving and bending with ease. <i>She lay gazing up at his tall lithe figure.</i>
malleability	The property of being physically malleable; the property of something that can be worked or hammered or shaped without breaking.
malleable	(of a metal or other material) able to be hammered or pressed into shape without breaking or cracking. <i>A malleable metal can be beaten into a sheet.</i>
plasticity	The quality of being easily shaped or moulded. <i>Fine clay at the right degree of plasticity is more useful.</i>
pliable	Capable of being bent or flexed or twisted without breaking. <i>Pliable teenage minds.</i>
pliant	Easily bent. <i>A more pliant prime minister.</i>
silhouette	Project on a background such as a screen like a silhouette. <i>The castle was silhouetted against the sky.</i>
slender	Being of delicate or slender build Frank Norris. <i>Slender wages.</i>
slim	A course or period of slimming. <i>Restructuring and slimming down the organization.</i>
sophisticated	Appealing to or frequented by people who are sophisticated. <i>A sophisticated lifestyle.</i>
stretch	Easily stretched. <i>Small squares of canvas were stretched over the bamboo frame.</i>

<u>susceptible</u>	(of a person) easily influenced by feelings or emotions; sensitive. <i>They only do it to tease him he s too susceptible.</i>
svelte	Being of delicate or slender build. <i>She was svelte and sophisticated.</i>
<u>thin</u>	Make thin or thinner. <i>A thin sliced loaf.</i>
urbane	Showing a high degree of refinement and the assurance that comes from wide social experience. <i>The supposedly urbane restrained English gentleman.</i>
waif	A young person who is thin and looks unhealthy or uncared for. <i>A little shop presided over by a Gothic waif in purple eyeshadow and lipstick.</i>
willowy	Slender and graceful. <i>Willowy meadow land.</i>
yielding	The act of conceding or yielding. <i>A gentle yielding person.</i>
