
## Supple as an Adjective

- (used of persons' bodies) capable of moving or bending freely.
- (used of e.g. personality traits) readily adaptable.
- Bending and moving easily and gracefully; flexible.
- Moving and bending with ease.
- Gracefully thin and bending and moving with ease.
- Not stiff or hard; easily manipulated.
- Capable of moving or bending freely.







#### Synonyms of "Supple" as an adjective (30 Words)

<u>acrobatic</u>	Performing, involving, or adept at spectacular gymnastic feats. An <b>acrobatic</b> dive.
<u>agile</u>	Able to move quickly and easily. Sleek and <b>agile</b> as a gymnast.
bendable	Capable of being bent or flexed or twisted without breaking.
<u>deft</u>	Neatly skilful and quick in one's movements. A <b>deft</b> waiter.
elastic	Capable of resuming original shape after stretching or compression; springy. <i>The labour supply is very elastic.</i>
elegant	(of a scientific theory or solution to a problem) pleasingly ingenious and simple. An <b>elegant</b> mathematical solution simple and precise and lucid.
fit	Meeting adequate standards for a purpose. A <b>fit</b> subject on which to correspond.
<u>flexible</u>	Capable of being changed. A <b>flexible</b> personality.
<u>graceful</u>	Suggesting taste, ease, and wealth. She was a tall girl slender and <b>graceful</b> .
limber	Capable of moving or bending freely. I have to practise to keep myself <b>limber</b> .
lissom	Moving and bending with ease. The kind of outfit that should be left to <b>lissom</b> teenagers.
lissome	Gracefully thin and bending and moving with ease.
<u>lithe</u>	Gracefully thin and bending and moving with ease. She lay gazing up at his tall <b>lithe</b> figure.
lithesome	Gracefully thin and bending and moving with ease.
loose-jointed	Loosely articulated or constructed.
<u>malleable</u>	Easily influenced. A <b>malleable</b> metal can be beaten into a sheet.
nimble	(of the mind) able to think and understand quickly. <i>As <b>nimble</b> as a deer.</i>
<u>plastic</u>	Made of plastic. <i>Plastic</i> bottles.



<u>pliable</u>	Able to adjust readily to different conditions. <i>Quality leather is <b>pliable</b> and will not crack.</i>
pliant	Easily bent. <b>Pliant</b> molten glass.
<u>resilient</u>	Recovering readily from adversity, depression, or the like. As <b>resilient</b> as seasoned hickory.
rubbery	Having a tough elastic texture, like that of rubber. Portions of <b>rubbery</b> unseasoned canned spaghetti.
sinuous	Having many curves and turns. <i>The <b>sinuous</b> grace of a cat.</i>
soft	Used chiefly as a direction or description in music soft in a quiet subdued tone. The government is not becoming <b>soft</b> on crime.
springy	Elastic; rebounds readily. The <b>springy</b> turf.
stretchable	Capable of being easily stretched and resuming former size or shape.
stretchy	(especially of material or a garment) able to stretch or be stretched easily. <i>Stretchy miniskirts</i> .
willowy	(of a person) tall, slim, and lithe. <i>Willowy meadow land</i> .
<u>workable</u>	Able to be worked, fashioned, or manipulated. More flour and salt can be added until they make a <b>workable</b> dough.
yielding	Inclined to yield to argument or influence or control. A timid <b>yielding</b> person.






### Usage Examples of "Supple" as an adjective

ductile	Capable of being shaped or bent or drawn out. <i>Ductile copper.</i>
ductility	The malleability of something that can be drawn into threads or wires or hammered into thin sheets.
easy	With ease easy is sometimes used informally for easily. Just wanted to take it <b>easy</b> .
extended	Fully extended or stretched forth. The <b>extended</b> airport runways can accommodate larger planes.
<u>flexible</u>	(of a person) ready and able to change so as to adapt to different circumstances. Small businesses which are dependent on <b>flexible</b> working hours.
gangly	Tall and thin and having long slender limbs.



<u>grace</u>	In Greek mythology three beautiful goddesses Aglaia Thalia and Euphrosyne believed to personify and bestow charm grace and beauty. <i>She has all the social graces.</i>
<u>graceful</u>	Suggesting taste, ease, and wealth. She was a tall girl slender and <b>graceful</b> .
impressionable	Easily impressed or influenced. Children are highly <b>impressionable</b> and susceptible to advertising.
lank	Of a person lanky. The man had <b>lank</b> brown greasy hair.
limber	Attach the limber. A <b>limber</b> imagination.
lissom	(of a person or their body) thin, supple, and graceful. <i>The kind of outfit that should be left to <b>lissom</b> teenagers.</i>
<u>lithe</u>	Moving and bending with ease. She lay gazing up at his tall <b>lithe</b> figure.
malleability	The property of being physically malleable; the property of something that can be worked or hammered or shaped without breaking.
<u>malleable</u>	(of a metal or other material) able to be hammered or pressed into shape without breaking or cracking. A <b>malleable</b> metal can be beaten into a sheet.
plasticity	The quality of being easily shaped or moulded. Fine clay at the right degree of <b>plasticity</b> is more useful.
<u>pliable</u>	Capable of being bent or flexed or twisted without breaking. <b>Pliable</b> teenage minds.
pliant	Easily bent. A more <b>pliant</b> prime minister.
<u>silhouette</u>	Project on a background such as a screen like a silhouette. <i>The castle was <b>silhouette</b>d against the sky.</i>
<u>slender</u>	Being of delicate or slender build Frank Norris. <i>Slender</i> wages.
slim	A course or period of slimming. Restructuring and <b>slim</b> ming down the organization.
<u>sophisticated</u>	Appealing to or frequented by people who are sophisticated. A <b>sophisticated</b> lifestyle.
stretch	Easily stretched. Small squares of canvas were <b>stretch</b> ed over the bamboo frame.



<u>susceptible</u>	(of a person) easily influenced by feelings or emotions; sensitive. They only do it to tease him he s too <b>susceptible</b> .
svelte	Being of delicate or slender build. She was <b>svelte</b> and sophisticated.
<u>thin</u>	Make thin or thinner. A <b>thin</b> sliced loaf.
urbane	Showing a high degree of refinement and the assurance that comes from wide social experience. The supposedly <b>urbane</b> restrained English gentleman.
waif	A young person who is thin and looks unhealthy or uncared for. A little shop presided over by a Gothic <b>waif</b> in purple eyeshadow and lipstick.
willowy	Slender and graceful. <i>Willowy meadow land</i> .
yielding	The act of conceding or yielding. A gentle <b>yielding</b> person.
