Associations of "Supplicant definition" (30 Words)

adjure	Command solemnly. <i>I adjure you to tell me the truth.</i>
appeal	(of the bowler or fielders) call on the umpire to declare a batsman out, traditionally with a shout of ‘How’s that?’. <i>I appealed to the law of 1900.</i>
ask	Require or ask for as a price or condition. <i>Has he asked you out yet.</i>
asking	The verbal act of requesting.
beg	Acquire food or money from someone by begging. <i>He begged his fellow passengers for help.</i>
beseech	Ask (someone) urgently and fervently to do something; implore; entreat. <i>You have got to believe me Violet beseeched him.</i>
cadge	Ask for or obtain (something to which one is not strictly entitled). <i>He cadged fivers off old school friends.</i>
conjure	Call (an image) to the mind. <i>They hoped to conjure up the spirit of their dead friend.</i>
demand	The act of demanding. <i>His demands for attention were unceasing.</i>
desperately	In a way that shows despair. <i>The soil desperately needed potash.</i>
entreat	Treat (someone) in a specified manner. <i>A message had been sent entreating aid for the Navahos.</i>
entreaty	Earnest or urgent request. <i>An entreaty to stop the fighting.</i>
exhortation	The act of exhorting; an earnest attempt at persuasion. <i>No amount of exhortation had any effect.</i>

<u>invitation</u>	The action of inviting someone to go somewhere or to do something. <i>A wedding invitation.</i>
invite	Invite someone to one's house. <i>Applications are invited for the post of Director.</i>
necessary	Absolutely essential. <i>It is not necessary for you to be here.</i>
necessity	Anything indispensable. <i>The necessity of providing parental guidance.</i>
need	Have need of. <i>I don't need your sarcasm.</i>
paging	Calling out the name of a person (especially by a loudspeaker system). <i>The public address system in the hospital was used for paging.</i>
<u>petition</u>	Write a petition for something to somebody request formally and in writing. <i>The organization is petitioning the EU for a moratorium on the patent.</i>
<u>plea</u>	A defendant's answer by a factual matter (as distinguished from a demurrer). <i>He made a dramatic plea for disarmament.</i>
<u>plead</u>	Make an allegation in an action or other legal proceeding especially answer the previous pleading of the other party by denying facts therein stated or by alleging new facts. <i>She was pleading insanity.</i>
<u>prayer</u>	The act of communicating with a deity (especially as a petition or in adoration or contrition or thanksgiving). <i>I'll say a prayer for him.</i>
<u>recourse</u>	Act of turning to for assistance. <i>His only recourse was the police.</i>
request	The verbal act of requesting. <i>The club's excursion was postponed at the request of some of the members.</i>
<u>solicit</u>	Make a solicitation or petition for something desired. <i>The young man was caught soliciting in the park.</i>
<u>solicitation</u>	The act of accosting someone and offering one's or someone else's services as a prostitute. <i>A solicitation to the king for relief.</i>
suppliant	Humbly entreating. <i>Their faces were wary and suppliant.</i>
supplicate	Ask for humbly or earnestly, as in prayer. <i>He supplicated the King for clemency.</i>
