### **Definitions of "Supplier" as a noun**

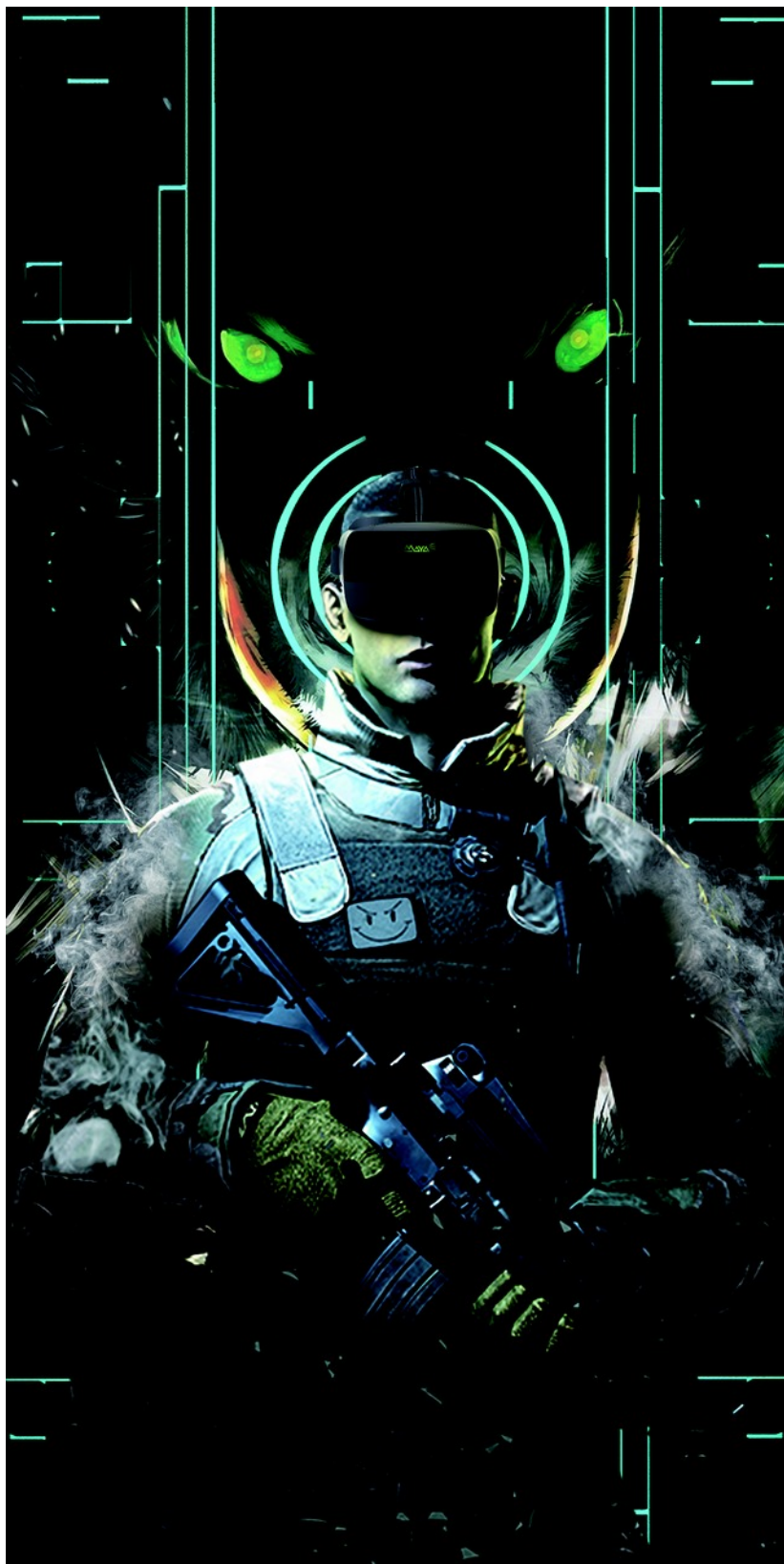
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “supplier” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A person or organization that provides something needed such as a product or service.*
- *Someone whose business is to supply a particular service or commodity.*



## Synonyms of "Supplier" as a noun (1 Word)

**provider** Someone whose business is to supply a particular service or commodity.  
*He didn't like the thought of Dad being the sole **provider** for the family again.*



## Usage Examples of "Supplier" as a noun

- *Suppliers of healthcare.*
- *The company has to pay suppliers within 90 days of purchase.*
- *Every major energy supplier upped their prices.*



## Associations of "Supplier" (30 Words)

<b>cater</b>	Supply food ready to eat; for parties and banquets. <i>He <b>catered</b> a lunch for 20 people.</i>
<b>contracted</b>	Reduced in size or pulled together. <i>The <b>contracted</b> pupils of her eyes.</i>
<b>create</b>	Create or manufacture a man made product. <i>Schoenberg <b>created</b> twelve tone music.</i>
<b>customer</b>	A person who buys goods or services from a shop or business. <i>Mr Harrison was a regular <b>customer</b> at the Golden Lion.</i>

<b>delicatessen</b>	A shop selling cooked meats, cheeses, and unusual or foreign prepared foods.
<b>distributor</b>	Electrical device that distributes voltage to the spark plugs of a gasoline engine in the order of the firing sequence. <i>A sports goods <b>distributor</b>.</i>
<b>fabrication</b>	The act of constructing something (as a piece of machinery). <i>The story was a complete <b>fabrication</b>.</i>
<b>factory</b>	A building or group of buildings where goods are manufactured or assembled chiefly by machine. <i>The group have become a rock and roll hit <b>factory</b>.</i>
<b>generate</b>	Produce (a sentence or other unit, especially a well-formed one) by the application of a finite set of rules to lexical or other linguistic input. <i>The hydroelectric plant needs to <b>generate</b> more electricity.</i>
<b>grocer</b>	A person who sells food and small household goods.
<b>importer</b>	A person or organization that brings goods or services into a country from abroad for sale. <i>People in underdeveloped regions have become clever <b>importers</b> of new knowledge.</i>
<b>make</b>	Make formulate or derive in the mind. <i>Clothes <b>make</b> the man.</i>
<b>maker</b>	A person or thing that makes or produces something. <i><b>Makers</b> of rubber products.</i>
<b>manufacture</b>	Manufactured articles. <i>Claims that the entire row had been <b>manufactured</b> by the press.</i>
<b>manufacturer</b>	A business engaged in manufacturing some product. <i>The <b>manufacturers</b> supply the goods to the distribution centre.</i>
<b>manufacturing</b>	The act of making something (a product) from raw materials. <i>Even in <b>manufacturing</b> they no longer dominate.</i>
<b>outsource</b>	Contract (work) out. <i>Many companies <b>outsource</b> and hire consultants in order to maintain a flexible workforce.</i>
<b>producer</b>	A person responsible for the financial and managerial aspects of the making of a film or broadcast or for staging a play, opera, etc. <i>He s the executive <b>producer</b> of weekday daytime shows.</i>
<b>product</b>	An artifact that has been created by someone or some process. <i>Too much <b>product</b> of too little quality.</i>

<b>provide</b>	Make a possibility or provide opportunity for permit to be attainable or cause to remain. <i>Neither will <b>provide</b> answers to these problems.</i>
<b>provider</b>	A person who earns money to support their family. <i>A leading <b>provider</b> of personal financial services.</i>
<b>provision</b>	Supply with provisions. <i>Farmers have been slow to make <b>provision</b> for their retirement.</i>
<b>purvey</b>	Provide or supply (food, drink, or other goods) as one's business. <i>We didn't want to <b>purvey</b> gloom and doom.</i>
<b>purveyor</b>	Someone who supplies provisions (especially food). <i>A <b>purveyor</b> of traditional Christian values.</i>
<b>repairer</b>	A skilled worker who mends or repairs things.
<b>restock</b>	Replenish (a store) with fresh stock or supplies. <i>He <b>restocked</b> his land with pheasants.</i>
<b>shop</b>	An act of going shopping. <i>A video <b>shop</b>.</i>
<b>supplement</b>	Add as a supplement to what seems insufficient. <i>Vitamins <b>supplemented</b> his meager diet.</i>
<b>supply</b>	The activity of supplying or providing something. <i>When she died no one could <b>supply</b> her place.</i>
<b>vitamin</b>	A pill containing a specified amount of a particular vitamin or vitamins taken as a dietary supplement. <i>Most people can get all the <b>vitamins</b> they need from a healthy diet.</i>
