Definitions of "Supplier" as a noun

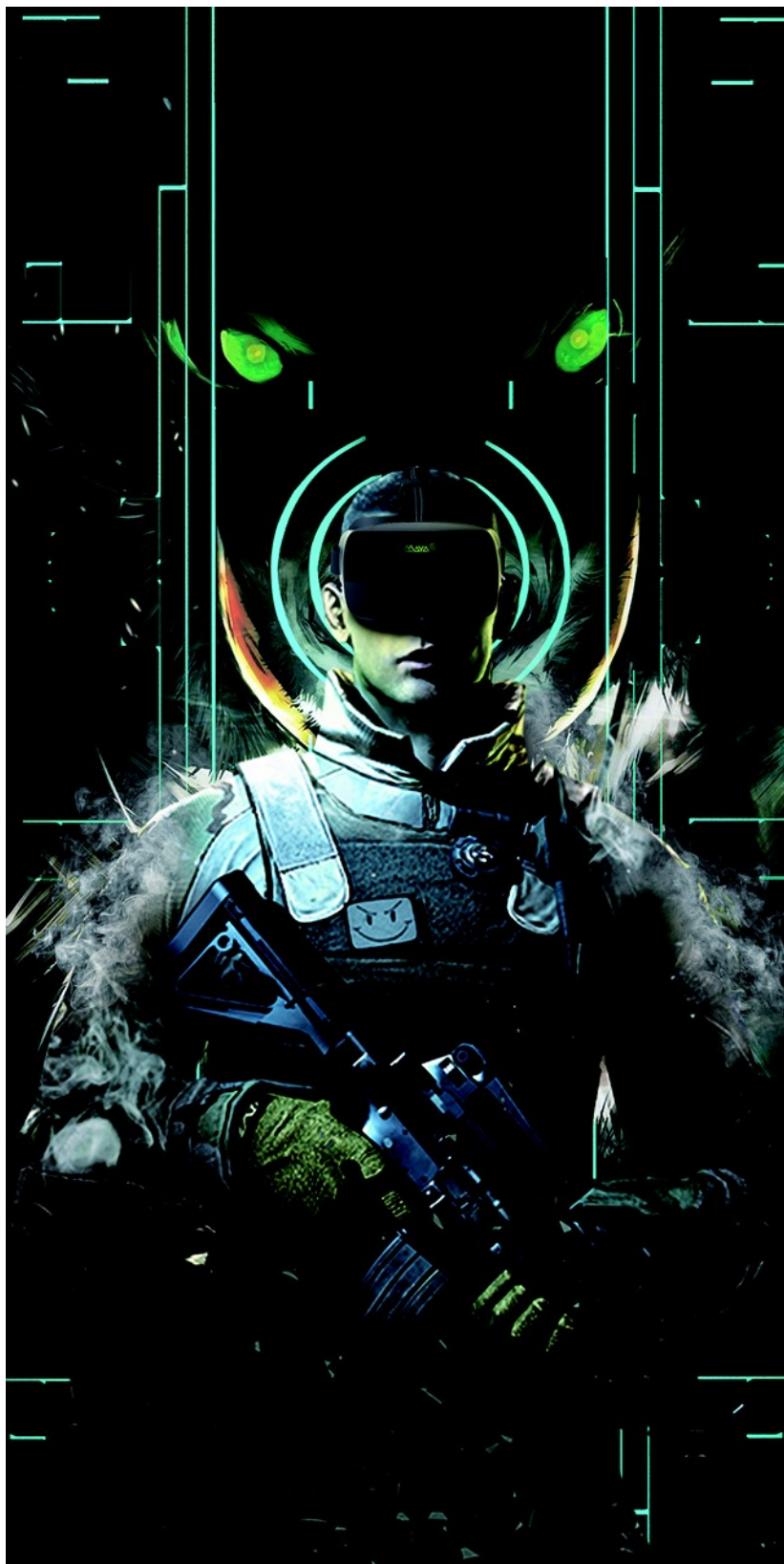
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “supplier” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A person or organization that provides something needed such as a product or service.*
- *Someone whose business is to supply a particular service or commodity.*



Synonyms of "Supplier" as a noun (1 Word)

provider Someone whose business is to supply a particular service or commodity.
*He didn't like the thought of Dad being the sole **provider** for the family again.*



Usage Examples of "Supplier" as a noun

- *Suppliers of healthcare.*
- *The company has to pay suppliers within 90 days of purchase.*
- *Every major energy supplier upped their prices.*



Associations of "Supplier" (30 Words)

cater	Supply food ready to eat; for parties and banquets. <i>He catered a lunch for 20 people.</i>
contracted	Reduced in size or pulled together. <i>The contracted pupils of her eyes.</i>
create	Create or manufacture a man made product. <i>Schoenberg created twelve tone music.</i>
customer	A person who buys goods or services from a shop or business. <i>Mr Harrison was a regular customer at the Golden Lion.</i>

delicatessen	A shop selling cooked meats, cheeses, and unusual or foreign prepared foods.
distributor	Electrical device that distributes voltage to the spark plugs of a gasoline engine in the order of the firing sequence. <i>A sports goods distributor.</i>
fabrication	The act of constructing something (as a piece of machinery). <i>The story was a complete fabrication.</i>
factory	A building or group of buildings where goods are manufactured or assembled chiefly by machine. <i>The group have become a rock and roll hit factory.</i>
generate	Produce (a sentence or other unit, especially a well-formed one) by the application of a finite set of rules to lexical or other linguistic input. <i>The hydroelectric plant needs to generate more electricity.</i>
grocer	A person who sells food and small household goods.
importer	A person or organization that brings goods or services into a country from abroad for sale. <i>People in underdeveloped regions have become clever importers of new knowledge.</i>
make	Make formulate or derive in the mind. <i>Clothes make the man.</i>
maker	A person or thing that makes or produces something. <i>Makers of rubber products.</i>
manufacture	Manufactured articles. <i>Claims that the entire row had been manufactured by the press.</i>
manufacturer	A business engaged in manufacturing some product. <i>The manufacturers supply the goods to the distribution centre.</i>
manufacturing	The act of making something (a product) from raw materials. <i>Even in manufacturing they no longer dominate.</i>
outsource	Contract (work) out. <i>Many companies outsource and hire consultants in order to maintain a flexible workforce.</i>
producer	A person responsible for the financial and managerial aspects of the making of a film or broadcast or for staging a play, opera, etc. <i>He s the executive producer of weekday daytime shows.</i>
product	An artifact that has been created by someone or some process. <i>Too much product of too little quality.</i>

provide	Make a possibility or provide opportunity for permit to be attainable or cause to remain. <i>Neither will provide answers to these problems.</i>
provider	A person who earns money to support their family. <i>A leading provider of personal financial services.</i>
provision	Supply with provisions. <i>Farmers have been slow to make provision for their retirement.</i>
purvey	Provide or supply (food, drink, or other goods) as one's business. <i>We didn't want to purvey gloom and doom.</i>
purveyor	Someone who supplies provisions (especially food). <i>A purveyor of traditional Christian values.</i>
repairer	A skilled worker who mends or repairs things.
restock	Replenish (a store) with fresh stock or supplies. <i>He restocked his land with pheasants.</i>
shop	An act of going shopping. <i>A video shop.</i>
supplement	Add as a supplement to what seems insufficient. <i>Vitamins supplemented his meager diet.</i>
supply	The activity of supplying or providing something. <i>When she died no one could supply her place.</i>
vitamin	A pill containing a specified amount of a particular vitamin or vitamins taken as a dietary supplement. <i>Most people can get all the vitamins they need from a healthy diet.</i>
