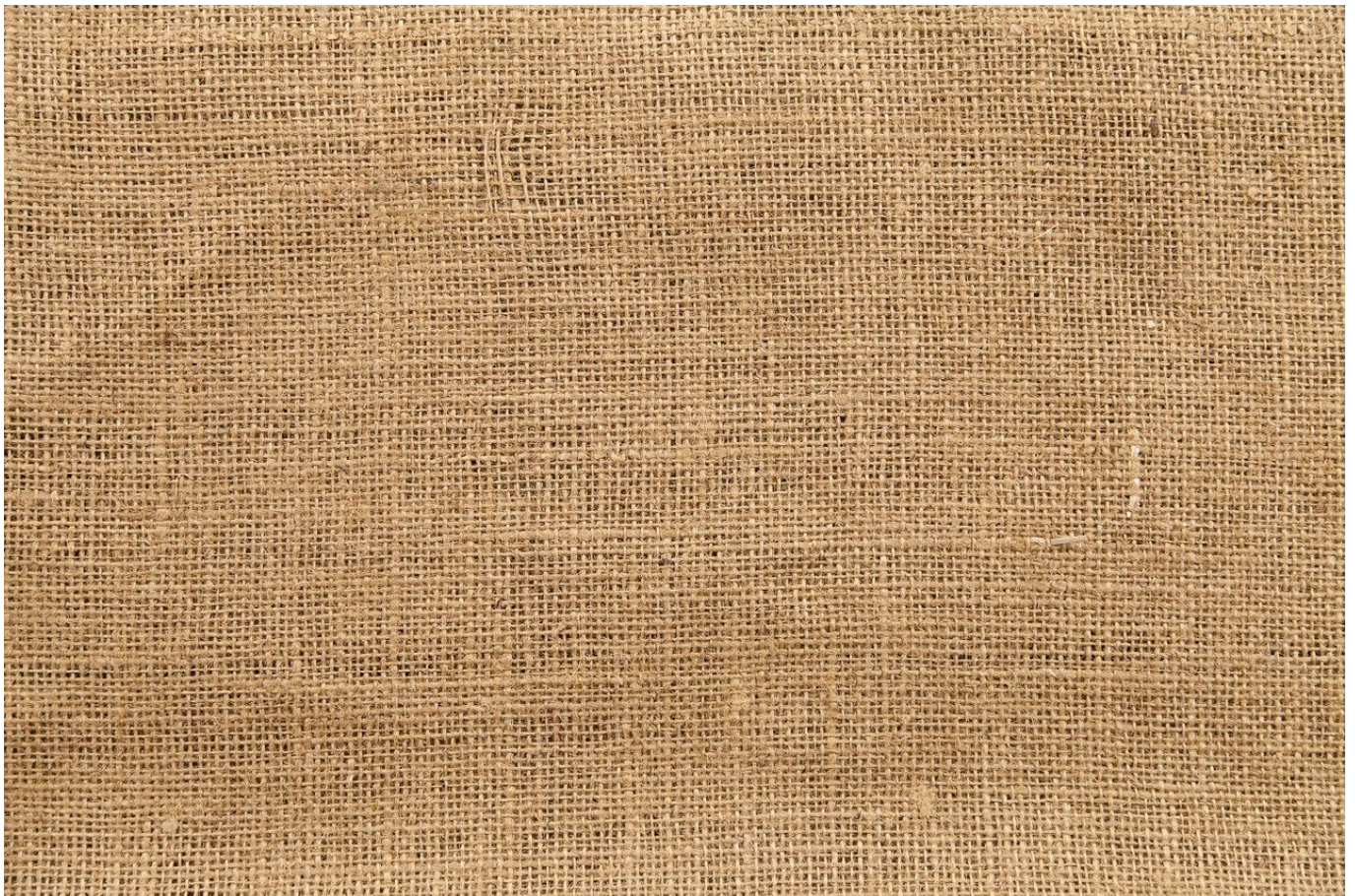
Surface as a Noun

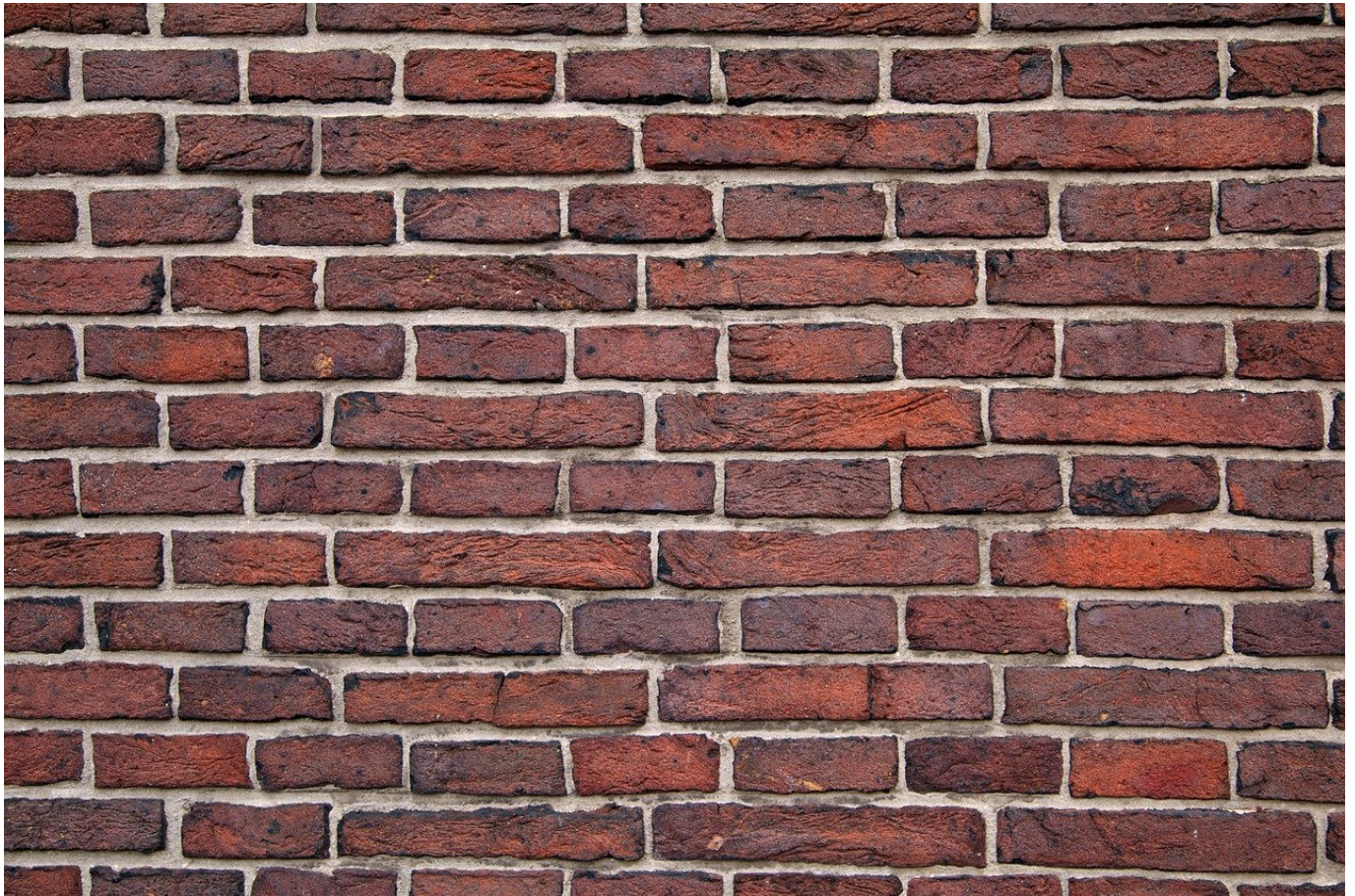
- *A superficial aspect as opposed to the real nature of something.*
- *The outward appearance of someone or something, especially as distinct from less obvious aspects.*

- *Information that has become public.*
- *The level top of something.*
- *The outermost level of the land or sea.*
- *A continuous set of points that has length and breadth but no thickness.*
- *The outside part or uppermost layer of something.*
- *A device that provides reactive force when in motion relative to the surrounding air; can lift or control a plane in flight.*
- *The extended two-dimensional outer boundary of a three-dimensional object.*
- *The outer boundary of an artifact or a material layer constituting or resembling such a boundary.*
- *The upper limit of a body of liquid.*

aerofoil	A structure with curved surfaces designed to give the most favourable ratio of lift to drag in flight, used as the basic form of the wings, fins, and tailplanes of most aircraft.
airfoil	A device that provides reactive force when in motion relative to the surrounding air; can lift or control a plane in flight.
at first glance	A highly unstable radioactive element (the heaviest of the halogen series); a decay product of uranium and thorium.
control surface	The economic policy of controlling or limiting or curbing prices or wages etc.
<u>counter</u>	A device used for counting. <i>The counter tells you how many pictures you have taken.</i>
earth's surface	The extended two-dimensional outer boundary of a three-dimensional object.
<u>exterior</u>	(in filming) an outdoor scene. <i>A jar with floral designs on the exterior.</i>
externally	Outward features.
<u>facade</u>	A deceptive outward appearance. <i>Her flawless public facade masked private despair.</i>
horizontal surface	Something that is oriented horizontally.
open	A clear or unobstructed space or expanse of land or water. <i>Guests were sitting in the open on the terrace.</i>
<u>outside</u>	The region that is outside of something. <i>Was he as straight as he appeared on the outside.</i>
stand	The position where a thing or person stands. <i>They cut down a stand of trees.</i>
table	A group seated at table for a meal. <i>The whole table was in gales of laughter.</i>
top	Covering for a hole especially a hole in the top of a container. <i>The bus shelter at the top of the road.</i>
work surface	A manifestation of energy; the transfer of energy from one physical system to another expressed as the product of a force and the distance through which it moves a body in the direction of that force.

become visible	Undergo a change or development.
coat	Form a coat over. <i>Her right leg was coated in plaster.</i>
come into sight	Come from; be connected by a relationship of blood, for example.
come into view	Move toward, travel toward something or somebody or approach something or somebody.
come on	Come to one's mind; suggest itself.
come out	Happen as a result.
come to light	Add up in number or quantity.
come to the surface	Come to pass; arrive, as in due course.
come to the top	Happen as a result.
come up	Add up in number or quantity.
crop up	Feed as in a meadow or pasture.
emerge	(of facts) become known. <i>Some nice results emerged from the study.</i>
get out of bed	Purchase.
get up	Apprehend and reproduce accurately.

materialize	Become actual fact; happen. <i>A medium she was reputed to materialize substances.</i>

spring up	Develop suddenly.
turn up	Let (something) fall or spill from a container.
wake	Be awake be alert be there. <i>We waked Jim last night.</i>

seeming Giving the impression of having a specified quality.
*His **seeming** honesty.*

superficial Denoting a quantity of a material expressed in terms of area covered rather than linear dimension or volume.
*The **superficial** report didn't give the true picture.*

denudation The removal of covering.

denude	Strip (something) of its covering, possessions, or assets. <i>Denude a forest.</i>
epidermis	The surface epithelium of the skin, overlying the dermis.
<u>expose</u>	Expose while ridiculing especially of pretentious or false claims and ideas. <i>The situation exposed a conflict within the government.</i>
<u>exterior</u>	Forming, situated on, or relating to the outside of something. <i>Beneath that assured exterior she s vulnerable.</i>
<u>external</u>	(of hardware) not contained in the main computer; peripheral. <i>An external concern for reputation.</i>
externalize	Express (a thought or feeling) in words or actions. <i>Elements of the internal construction were externalized on to the facade.</i>
integument	A tough outer protective layer, especially that of an animal or plant. <i>This chemical compound is found in the integument of the seed.</i>
<u>ostensible</u>	Appearing as such but not necessarily so. <i>The ostensible truth of their theories.</i>
outdoors	In or into the open air; outside a building or shelter. <i>He wanted to get outdoors a little.</i>
outer	A shot that strikes the outer. <i>Boots with stiff leather outers.</i>
outermost	Situated at the farthest possible point from a center. <i>The outermost layer of the earth.</i>
<u>outside</u>	On the outside. <i>Record the date on the outside of the file.</i>
outward	Outwards. <i>The outward voyage.</i>
<u>outwardly</u>	On the surface. <i>Outwardly featureless modern offices.</i>
peripheral	A peripheral device. <i>The peripheral areas of Europe.</i>
putative	Purported; commonly put forth or accepted as true on inconclusive grounds. <i>The putative author of the book.</i>
quasi	Having some resemblance. <i>A quasi success.</i>
sapwood	The soft outer layers of recently formed wood between the heartwood and the bark, containing the functioning vascular tissue.
<u>seeming</u>	Appearing to be real or true, but not necessarily being so; apparent. <i>An angry seeming man.</i>

- semblance** Resemblance similarity.
*It bears some **semblance** to the thing I have in mind.*
- satter** Speak with spotty or superficial knowledge.
*She **satters** Russian.*
- superficial** Appearing to be true or real only until examined more closely.
*In his paper he showed a very **superficial** understanding of psychoanalytic theory.*
