## **Surprisingly as an Adverb**

### **Definitions of "Surprisingly" as an adverb**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “surprisingly” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *In an amazing manner; to everyone's surprise.*
- *In a surprising manner.*
- *Used to express surprise at an event or situation.*
- *In a way that causes surprise; unexpectedly.*



## Synonyms of "Surprisingly" as an adverb (2 Words)

- amazingly** Very; extremely (usually expressing approval).  
*There are so many **amazingly** good clarets.*
- astonishingly** Extremely surprisingly or impressively.  
***Astonishingly** the novel is still selling 7 600 copies a year.*

- *The finale ends surprisingly.*
- *The move was surprisingly easy.*
- *He rather surprisingly took up the cause.*
- *Perhaps surprisingly, all survived.*

<b><u>admirable</u></b>	Deserving of the highest esteem or admiration. <i>He has one <b>admirable</b> quality he is totally honest.</i>
<b><u>amaze</u></b>	Surprise (someone) greatly; fill with astonishment. <i>Your ability to speak six languages <b>amazes</b> me.</i>
<b>amazing</b>	Causing great surprise or wonder; astonishing. <i>New York is an <b>amazing</b> city.</i>

<b><u>astounding</u></b>	Surprisingly impressive or notable. <i>The summit offers <b>astounding</b> views.</i>
<b>awesome</b>	Extremely well; excellently. <i>The <b>awesome</b> complexity of the universe.</i>
<b>curiously</b>	With curiosity. <i>Had a <b>curiously</b> husky voice.</i>
<b>exceeding</b>	Extremely exceedingly. <i>An ale of <b>exceeding</b> poor quality.</i>
<b>excellent</b>	Very good; of the highest quality. <i>The lorry was in <b>excellent</b> condition.</i>
<b><u>impress</u></b>	Produce or try to produce a vivid impression of. <i>His desire to put his own <b>impress</b> on the films he made.</i>
<b><u>inconceivable</u></b>	Totally unlikely. <i>It seemed <b>inconceivable</b> that the president had been unaware of what was going on.</i>
<b>incredible</b>	Very good; wonderful. <i>An almost <b>incredible</b> tale of triumph and tragedy.</i>
<b>incredibly</b>	To a great degree; extremely. <i>Michele was <b>incredibly</b> brave.</i>

<b><u>marvelous</u></b>	Too improbable to admit of belief. <i>A <b>marvelous</b> collection of rare books.</i>
<b>miraculously</b>	In a remarkable and extremely lucky manner. <i>The two drivers <b>miraculously</b> escaped with only minor injuries.</i>
<b><u>paradoxically</u></b>	In a seemingly absurd or self-contradictory way. <i>The strength of capitalism is <b>paradoxically</b> also its weakness.</i>
<b>prodigious</b>	Remarkably or impressively great in extent, size, or degree. <i>A <b>prodigious</b> storm.</i>
<b>profound</b>	Profound quality. <i>A <b>profound</b> silence.</i>
<b><u>staggering</u></b>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>The <b>staggering</b> bills for maintenance and repair.</i>
<b><u>startling</u></b>	Very surprising, astonishing, or remarkable. <i><b>Startling</b> news.</i>
<b><u>surprising</u></b>	Causing surprise or wonder or amazement. <i>Leaped up with <b>surprising</b> agility.</i>
<b><u>unbelievable</u></b>	So great or extreme as to be difficult to believe; extraordinary. <i><b>Unbelievable</b> or not it happened.</i>
<b><u>unexpected</u></b>	Not expected or regarded as likely to happen. <i>His death was totally <b>unexpected</b>.</i>
<b>unexpectedly</b>	Without advance planning. <i>He died <b>unexpectedly</b> of a heart attack.</i>
<b>unusually</b>	To a remarkable degree or extent. <i>The name is spelt <b>unusually</b>.</i>
<b>wonderful</b>	Inspiring delight, pleasure, or admiration; extremely good; marvellous. <i>They all think she s <b>wonderful</b>.</i>
