Definitions of "Surprisingly" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “surprisingly” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *In an amazing manner; to everyone's surprise.*
- *In a surprising manner.*
- *Used to express surprise at an event or situation.*
- *In a way that causes surprise; unexpectedly.*



Synonyms of "Surprisingly" as an adverb (2 Words)

- amazingly** Very; extremely (usually expressing approval).
*There are so many **amazingly** good clarets.*
- astonishingly** Extremely surprisingly or impressively.
***Astonishingly** the novel is still selling 7 600 copies a year.*

Usage Examples of "Surprisingly" as an adverb

- *The finale ends surprisingly.*
- *The move was surprisingly easy.*
- *He rather surprisingly took up the cause.*
- *Perhaps surprisingly, all survived.*

| curiously | With curiosity. <i>Had a curiously husky voice.</i> |
| exceeding | Extremely exceedingly. <i>An ale of exceeding poor quality.</i> |
| excellent | Very good; of the highest quality. <i>The lorry was in excellent condition.</i> |
| <u>impress</u> | Produce or try to produce a vivid impression of. <i>His desire to put his own impress on the films he made.</i> |
| <u>inconceivable</u> | Totally unlikely. <i>It seemed inconceivable that the president had been unaware of what was going on.</i> |
| incredible | Very good; wonderful. <i>An almost incredible tale of triumph and tragedy.</i> |
| incredibly | To a great degree; extremely. <i>Michele was incredibly brave.</i> |

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| <u>marvelous</u> | Too improbable to admit of belief. <i>A marvelous collection of rare books.</i> |
| miraculously | In a remarkable and extremely lucky manner. <i>The two drivers miraculously escaped with only minor injuries.</i> |
| <u>paradoxically</u> | In a seemingly absurd or self-contradictory way. <i>The strength of capitalism is paradoxically also its weakness.</i> |
| prodigious | Remarkably or impressively great in extent, size, or degree. <i>A prodigious storm.</i> |
| profound | Profound quality. <i>A profound silence.</i> |
| <u>staggering</u> | So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>The staggering bills for maintenance and repair.</i> |
| <u>startling</u> | Very surprising, astonishing, or remarkable. <i>Startling news.</i> |
| <u>surprising</u> | Causing surprise or wonder or amazement. <i>Leaped up with surprising agility.</i> |
| <u>unbelievable</u> | So great or extreme as to be difficult to believe; extraordinary. <i>Unbelievable or not it happened.</i> |
| <u>unexpected</u> | Not expected or regarded as likely to happen. <i>His death was totally unexpected.</i> |
| unexpectedly | Without advance planning. <i>He died unexpectedly of a heart attack.</i> |
| unusually | To a remarkable degree or extent. <i>The name is spelt unusually.</i> |
| wonderful | Inspiring delight, pleasure, or admiration; extremely good; marvellous. <i>They all think she s wonderful.</i> |
