- ambient** Relating to ambient music.  
*The **ambient** temperature.*
- area** A subject of study.  
*It was a mountainous **area**.*
- assemble** Collect in one place.  
*The males **assemble** and hang by their front legs within a yard or two of the female.*
- assembler** A program for converting instructions written in low-level symbolic code into machine code.
- besiege** Surround and harass.  
*The Turks **besieged** Vienna.*
- bevy** A large group of people or things of a particular kind.  
*A **bevy** of young beach boys swarmed around him.*

<b>border</b>	Provide with a border or edge. <i>She stitched a <b>border</b> on to one of the plain white saris.</i>
<b>circuit</b>	Make a circuit. <i>A ten day coach <b>circuit</b> of the island.</i>
<b>commune</b>	A territorial division similar to a French commune in other countries. <i>He seemed to <b>commune</b> with nature.</i>
<b>correlate</b>	Either of two or more related or complementary variables. <i>Strategies to promote health should pay greater attention to financial hardship and other <b>correlates</b> of poverty.</i>
<b>crowd</b>	Cause to herd drive or crowd together. <i>Men in straw boaters and waxed mustaches <b>crowded</b> the verandah.</i>
<b>delimit</b>	Be opposite to; of angles and sides, in geometry. <i>Agreements <b>delimiting</b> fishing zones.</i> (of a microprocessor) designed and built as an integral part of a system or device.
<b>embedded</b>	<i>Peach and plum seeds <b>embedded</b> in a sweet edible pulp.</i>
<b>encase</b>	Enclose in, or as if in, a case. <i>My feet were <b>encased</b> in mud.</i>
<b>encircle</b>	Bind with something round or circular. <i>The town is <b>encircled</b> by fortified walls.</i>
<b>enclose</b>	Enclose or enfold completely with or as if with a covering. <i>Breakwaters <b>enclosed</b> the harbour.</i>
<b>enclosed</b>	Surrounded or closed off on all sides. <i>An <b>enclosed</b> yard.</i>
<b>engulf</b>	Eat or swallow (something) whole. <i>The bright light <b>engulfed</b> him completely.</i>
<b>envelop</b>	Enclose or enfold completely with or as if with a covering. <i>A feeling of despair <b>enveloped</b> him.</i>
<b>environ</b>	Extend on all sides of simultaneously; encircle. <i>The stone circle was <b>enviored</b> by an expanse of peat soil.</i>
<b>in</b>	Expressing arrival. <i>Took the <b>in</b> bus.</i>
<b>included</b>	Contained as part of a whole being considered. <i>Service tax <b>included</b>.</i>
<b>involved</b>	Emotionally involved. <i>The <b>involved</b> muscles.</i>

<b>outskirts</b>	Outlying areas (as of a city or town). <i>They mingled in the <b>outskirts</b> of the crowd.</i>
<b>peristyle</b>	A space such as a court or porch that is surrounded or edged by a peristyle.
<b>precinct</b>	The police station situated in a precinct. <i>At the <b>precinct</b> a desk sergeant ran through her ID.</i>
<b>put</b>	Put into a certain place or abstract location. <i>India has <b>put</b> three experimental satellites into space.</i>
<b>seal</b>	The pelt or fur especially the underfur of a seal. <i>He folded it <b>sealed</b> the envelope and walked to the postbox.</i>
<b><u>surround</u></b>	The area encircling something surroundings. <i>An oak fireplace <b>surround</b>.</i>
<b>welder</b>	Joins pieces of metal by welding them together. <i>He worked as a <b>welder</b> in a steel factory.</i>
