fact	The truth about events as opposed to interpretation. <i>A body of fact.</i>
natural selection	A notation cancelling a previous sharp or flat.
reality	Relating to reality TV. <i>He refuses to face <b>reality</b>.</i>



selection	A plot of land acquired by selection. Blocks ranging in area from 158 to 3 102 acres have been thrown open for <b>selection</b> .
survival of the fittest	A natural process resulting in the evolution of organisms best adapted to the environment.

<u>bear</u>	Take on as one's own the expenses or debts of another person. <b>Bear</b> a heavy load.
<u>beset</u>	Annoy continually or chronically. The social problems that <b>beset</b> the UK.
<u>bide</u>	Dwell. How long must I <b>bide</b> here to wait for the answer.
breeding	The production of animals or plants by inbreeding or hybridization. The flooding of the rivers is a trigger for <b>breeding</b> to start.

<u>endurance</u>	The power to withstand hardship or stress. The annual 24 hour <b>endurance</b> race.
existence	A way of living. <i>Our stressed out urban <b>existence</b>.</i>
facsimile	Send something via a facsimile machine. The ride was <b>facsimile</b> d for another theme park.
feeding	The act of consuming food.
growth	Something that has grown or is growing. Keeping a journal can be a vital step in our personal <b>growth</b> .
imitate	Copy (a person's speech or mannerisms), especially for comic effect. Synthetic fabrics can now <b>imitate</b> everything from silk to rubber.
livelihood	A means of securing the necessities of life. <i>He could no longer earn his own <b>livelihood</b>.</i>
rearing	Rearing on left hind leg with forelegs elevated and head usually in profile.
<u>replica</u>	An exact copy or model of something, especially one on a smaller scale. It is a <b>replica</b> of an antique plaque.
<u>replicate</u>	Reproduce or make an exact copy of. Five <b>replicate</b> s were performed per dilution.
reproduce	Be copied with a specified degree of success. An individual needs to avoid being eaten until it has <b>reproduce</b> d.
reproduction	The process of generating offspring. Gutenberg s <b>reproduction</b> of holy texts was far more efficient.
<u>resemble</u>	Appear like; be similar or bear a likeness to. <i>Some people <b>resemble</b> their dogs.</i>
subsist	Provide sustenance for. The problem of <b>subsist</b> ing the poor in a period of high bread prices.
<u>subsistence</u>	The means of maintaining or supporting oneself. Social security provided only a bare <b>subsistence</b> .
suffering	Psychological suffering. <i>Suffering</i> refugees.
<u>survive</u>	Live longer than. These superstitions <b>survive</b> in the backwaters of America.
<u>sustain</u>	An effect or facility on a keyboard or electronic instrument whereby a note can be sustained after the key is released. We <b>sustain</b> ed ourselves on bread and water.



triplicate	Existing in three copies or examples. <i>Titles which have been sparingly ordered can be later duplicated or</i> <i>triplicate</i> d.
<u>upkeep</u>	Activity involved in maintaining something in good working order. <i>Payments for the children s <b>upkeep</b></i> .
vegetal	Relating to that pole of the ovum or embryo that contains the less active cytoplasm, and frequently most of the yolk, in the early stages of development. A <b>vegetal</b> aroma.
vegetative	Characterized by asexual processes. A <b>vegetative</b> replicating phase.
<u>withstand</u>	Resist or confront with resistance. The structure had been designed to <b>withstand</b> winds of more than 100 mph.
