### Definitions of "Survival" as a noun

- *The state or fact of continuing to live or exist, typically in spite of an accident, ordeal, or difficult circumstances.*
- *Something that survives.*
- *An object or practice that has continued to exist from an earlier time.*
- *A state of surviving; remaining alive.*



## Synonyms of "Survival" as a noun (8 Words)

### actuality

The state of actually existing objectively.

*The building looked as impressive in **actuality** as it did in magazines.*

### being

Being alive living.

*A point of view gradually coming into **being**.*

### endurance

The ability to endure an unpleasant or difficult process or situation without giving way.

*The marathon tests a runner's **endurance**.*

### **fact**

The truth about events as opposed to interpretation.

*A body of **fact**.*

### **natural selection**

A notation cancelling a previous sharp or flat.

### **reality**

Relating to reality TV.

*He refuses to face **reality**.*

- selection** A plot of land acquired by selection. Blocks ranging in area from 158 to 3 102 acres have been thrown open for **selection**.
- survival of the fittest** A natural process resulting in the evolution of organisms best adapted to the environment.

<b>baby</b>	Treat someone as a baby pamper or be overprotective towards. <i>It was great to feel my <b>baby</b> moving about inside.</i>
<b>bear</b>	Take on as one's own the expenses or debts of another person. <i><b>Bear</b> a heavy load.</i>
<b>beset</b>	Annoy continually or chronically. <i>The social problems that <b>beset</b> the UK.</i>
<b>bide</b>	Dwell. <i>How long must I <b>bide</b> here to wait for the answer.</i>
<b>breeding</b>	The production of animals or plants by inbreeding or hybridization. <i>The flooding of the rivers is a trigger for <b>breeding</b> to start.</i>
<b>disaster</b>	An event or fact that has unfortunate consequences. <i>His policies were a <b>disaster</b>.</i>
<b>emulate</b>	Imitate the function of (another system), as by modifying the hardware or the software. <i>Most rulers wished to <b>emulate</b> Alexander the Great.</i>

<b><u>endurance</u></b>	The power to withstand hardship or stress. <i>The annual 24 hour <b>endurance</b> race.</i>
<b>existence</b>	A way of living. <i>Our stressed out urban <b>existence</b>.</i>
<b>facsimile</b>	Send something via a facsimile machine. <i>The ride was <b>facsimiled</b> for another theme park.</i>
<b>feeding</b>	The act of consuming food.
<b>growth</b>	Something that has grown or is growing. <i>Keeping a journal can be a vital step in our personal <b>growth</b>.</i>
<b>imitate</b>	Copy (a person's speech or mannerisms), especially for comic effect. <i>Synthetic fabrics can now <b>imitate</b> everything from silk to rubber.</i>
<b>livelihood</b>	A means of securing the necessities of life. <i>He could no longer earn his own <b>livelihood</b>.</i>
<b>rearing</b>	Rearing on left hind leg with forelegs elevated and head usually in profile.
<b><u>replica</u></b>	An exact copy or model of something, especially one on a smaller scale. <i>It is a <b>replica</b> of an antique plaque.</i>
<b><u>replicate</u></b>	Reproduce or make an exact copy of. <i>Five <b>replicates</b> were performed per dilution.</i>
<b>reproduce</b>	Be copied with a specified degree of success. <i>An individual needs to avoid being eaten until it has <b>reproduced</b>.</i>
<b><u>reproduction</u></b>	The process of generating offspring. <i>Gutenberg's <b>reproduction</b> of holy texts was far more efficient.</i>
<b><u>resemble</u></b>	Appear like; be similar or bear a likeness to. <i>Some people <b>resemble</b> their dogs.</i>
<b>subsist</b>	Provide sustenance for. <i>The problem of <b>subsisting</b> the poor in a period of high bread prices.</i>
<b><u>subsistence</u></b>	The means of maintaining or supporting oneself. <i>Social security provided only a bare <b>subsistence</b>.</i>
<b>suffering</b>	Psychological suffering. <i><b>Suffering</b> refugees.</i>
<b><u>survive</u></b>	Live longer than. <i>These superstitions <b>survive</b> in the backwaters of America.</i>
<b><u>sustain</u></b>	An effect or facility on a keyboard or electronic instrument whereby a note can be sustained after the key is released. <i>We <b>sustained</b> ourselves on bread and water.</i>

- triplicate** Existing in three copies or examples.  
*Titles which have been sparingly ordered can be later duplicated or **triplicated**.*
- upkeep** Activity involved in maintaining something in good working order.  
*Payments for the children s **upkeep**.*
- vegetal** Relating to that pole of the ovum or embryo that contains the less active cytoplasm, and frequently most of the yolk, in the early stages of development.  
*A **vegetal** aroma.*
- vegetative** Characterized by asexual processes.  
*A **vegetative** replicating phase.*
- withstand** Resist or confront with resistance.  
*The structure had been designed to **withstand** winds of more than 100 mph.*
