- *Remain alive after the death of (a particular person).*
- *Continue to live or exist in spite of (an accident or ordeal).*
- *Continue in existence after (an adversity, etc).*
- *Support oneself.*
- *Continue to live and avoid dying.*
- *Continue to live through hardship or adversity.*
- *Live longer than.*

<b>carry on</b>	Sing or play against other voices or parts.

<b>go</b>	Go through in search of something search through someone s belongings in an unauthorized way. <i>You re trying to squeeze a quart into a pint pot and it just won t <b>go</b>.</i>
<b>go on</b>	Have a turn; make one's move in a game.
<b>hold on</b>	Be the physical support of; carry the weight of.
<b>hold out</b>	Protect against a challenge or attack.
<b>hold up</b>	Have room for; hold without crowding.
<b>keep body and soul together</b>	Keep under control; keep in check.
<b>keep on</b>	Have as a supply.
<b>last</b>	Continue to live and avoid dying. <i>How long can a person <b>last</b> without food and water.</i>
<b>linger</b>	Move to and fro. <i>The shy student <b>lingered</b> in the corner.</i>
<b>live</b>	Have life be alive. <i>The race car driver <b>lived</b> through several very serious accidents.</i>
<b>live after</b>	Continue to live through hardship or adversity.
<b>live longer than</b>	Pursue a positive and satisfying existence.
<b>live on</b>	Have life, be alive.
<b>live on after</b>	Have firsthand knowledge of states, situations, emotions, or sensations.
<b>make it</b>	Make by combining materials and parts.
<b>outlast</b>	Live longer than. <i>The kind of beauty that will <b>outlast</b> youth.</i>
<b>outlive</b>	Survive or last beyond (a specified period or expected lifespan). <i>She <b>outlived</b> her husband by many years.</i>
<b>persevere</b>	Be persistent, refuse to stop. <i>His family <b>persevered</b> with his treatment.</i>
<b>persist</b>	Be persistent refuse to stop. <i>He <b>persisted</b> to call me every night.</i>
<b>pull round</b>	Perform an act, usually with a negative connotation.
<b>pull through</b>	Move into a certain direction.
<b>remain</b>	Stay the same remain in a certain state. <i>Despite student protests he <b>remained</b> Dean for another year.</i>
<b>remain alive</b>	Continue in a place, position, or situation.
<b>remain alive after</b>	Continue in a place, position, or situation.

**subsist**

Provide sustenance for.

*The court may treat a contract as still **subsisting**.*

**sustain oneself**

Supply with necessities and support.

<b><u>existential</u></b>	Of or as conceived by existentialism. <i>Formal logicians are not concerned with <b>existential</b> matters.</i>
<b>existing</b>	Existing in something specified. <i>Depletion of the oxygen <b>existing</b> in the bloodstream.</i>
<b>farmhouse</b>	House for a farmer and family. <i>A <b>farmhouse</b> kitchen.</i>

- upkeep** The process of keeping something in good condition.  
*We will be responsible for the **upkeep** of the access road.*
- viability** Ability to survive or live successfully.  
*Pregnancy depends on the **viability** of the sperm and egg.*
- withstand** Resist or confront with resistance.  
*The new material **withstands** even the greatest wear and tear.*
