


| <u>income</u> | The financial gain (earned or unearned) accruing over a given period of time. <i>Figures showed an overall increase in income this year.</i> |

| livelihood | The financial means whereby one lives. He could no longer earn his own livelihood . |
| <u>living</u> | The condition of living or the state of being alive. <i>He was offered the living of St Katherine s.</i> |
| maintenance | Means of maintenance of a family or group. <i>Car maintenance</i> . |
| means | Considerable capital (wealth or income. <i>Resolving disputes by peaceful means.</i> |
| means of keeping body and soul together | An instrumentality for accomplishing some end. |
| means of support | An instrumentality for accomplishing some end. |
| <u>nourishment</u> | The action of nourishing someone or something. Tubers from which plants obtain nourishment . |
| nutriment | Nourishment; sustenance. <i>The bees reprocess the food and extract the last particle of</i> nutriment from it. |
| <u>nutrition</u> | The branch of science that deals with nutrients and nutrition particularly in humans. A feeding tube gives her nutrition and water. |
| provisions | A stock or supply of foods. |
| rations | The food allowance for one day (especially for service personnel. |
| source of income | A process by which energy or a substance enters a system. |
| <u>subsistence</u> | The means of maintaining or supporting oneself. <i>The garden provided not only</i> subsistence but a little cash crop. |
| support | Supporting structure that holds up or provides a foundation. <i>He leaned against the wall for support.</i> |
| sustainment | The support or maintenance of someone or something, especially military equipment or personnel. The sustainment of our current and future army depends on continuing logistics transformation. |



| sustentation | The act of sustaining life by food or providing a means of subsistence. <i>Provision is made for the sustentation of preachers.</i> |

| victuals | A stock or supply of foods. |
