- breadth** The distance or measurement from side to side of something; width.  
*She has the advantage of **breadth** of experience.*
- brim** The top edge of a vessel or other container.  
*He is **brimming** with ideas.*
- broad** Broad in scope or content.  
*Generous and **broad** sympathies.*

<b>capacious</b>	Large in capacity. <i>She rummaged in her <b>capacious</b> handbag.</i>
<b>deep</b>	Far down or in deeply. <i>They were <b>deep</b> in their own thoughts.</i>
<b>depth</b>	A point far below the surface. <i>He had sunk to the <b>depths</b> of addiction.</i>
<b>expanded</b>	Being or having been enlarged or extended. <i>The <b>expanded</b> fins of the ray.</i>
<b><u>expanse</u></b>	A wide and open space or area as of surface or land or sky. <i>The moth has a wing <b>expanse</b> of 20 to 24 mm.</i>
<b>extensive</b>	Covering or affecting a large area. <i>An <b>extensive</b> Roman settlement in northwest England.</i>
<b><u>extensively</u></b>	To a large or detailed degree. <i>Her husband travelled <b>extensively</b> in his job.</i>
<b>gamut</b>	The lowest note in the gamut scale. <i>The whole <b>gamut</b> of human emotion.</i>
<b>huge</b>	Extremely popular or successful. <i>She s made a <b>huge</b> mistake.</i>
<b>large</b>	Fairly large or important in effect influential. <i>We can afford to take a <b>larger</b> view of the situation.</i>
<b>opened</b>	Made open or clear. <i>The newly <b>opened</b> road.</i>
<b>outspread</b>	Spread out. <i>That eagle <b>outspreading</b> his wings for flight.</i>
<b>oversize</b>	Larger than normal for its kind.
<b>panoramic</b>	As from an altitude or distance. <i>His <b>panoramic</b> vision of post World War I peace.</i>
<b>plank</b>	Cover with planks. <i>He <b>planked</b> the money on the table.</i>
<b><u>prevalence</u></b>	The ratio (for a given time period) of the number of occurrences of a disease or event to the number of units at risk in the population. <i>The <b>prevalence</b> of obesity in adults.</i>
<b>reach</b>	Reach a goal. <i>Goodbye she said as they <b>reached</b> the door.</i>
<b>roomy</b>	An associate who shares a room with you. <i>A <b>roomy</b> but sparsely furnished apartment.</i>

- spacious** Having ample space.  
*The hotel has a **spacious** lounge and TV room.*
- vast** Unusually great in size or amount or degree or especially extent or scope.  
*At **vast** or immense expense.*
- verbose** Using or containing too many words.  
*Much academic language is obscure and **verbose**.*
- wide** A ball that is judged to be too wide of the stumps for the batsman to play for which an extra is awarded to the batting side.  
*Won by a **wide** margin.*
- widening** A part of a road that has been widened to allow cars to pass or park.
- width** Wide range or extent.  
*The **width** of experience required for these positions.*
- wingspan** The maximum extent across the wings of an aircraft or of a bird or other flying animal, measured from tip to tip.  
*An eagle with a **wingspan** of 7 ft.*
