## Associations of "Sweltering" (30 Words)

<b>boiling</b>	At or near boiling point. <i><b>Boiling</b> mad.</i>
<b>carburetor</b>	Mixes air with gasoline vapor prior to explosion.
<b>conduction</b>	The transmission of impulses along nerves.
<b>convection</b>	The movement caused within a fluid by the tendency of hotter and therefore less dense material to rise, and colder, denser material to sink under the influence of gravity, which consequently results in transfer of heat. <i>Upward <b>convection</b> in the troposphere carries water vapour and sulphur dioxide above the clouds.</i>
<b>fervid</b>	Extremely hot- Nathaniel Hawthorne- Frances Trollope. <i>His <b>fervid</b> protestations of love.</i>

<b>geyser</b>	To overflow like a geyser. <i>The pipe sent up a <b>geyser</b> of sewer water into the street.</i>
<b>heat</b>	Provide with heat. <i><b>Heat</b> the water on the stove.</i>
<b>heatstroke</b>	Collapse caused by exposure to excessive heat.
<b>hot</b>	Make or become hot. <i>A <b>hot</b> temper.</i>
<b>igneous</b>	Relating to or involving volcanic or plutonic processes. <i>Rocks formed by <b>igneous</b> agents.</i>
<b>isotherm</b>	(meteorology) an isogram connecting points having the same temperature at a given time.
<b>isothermal</b>	Of a process or change taking place at constant temperature. <i>The <b>isothermal</b> layer of the atmosphere.</i>
<b>locomotive</b>	A wheeled vehicle consisting of a self-propelled engine that is used to draw trains along railway tracks. <i><b>Locomotive</b> power.</i>
<b>lukewarm</b>	Moderately warm. <i>He hates <b>lukewarm</b> coffee.</i>
<b>midsummer</b>	The summer solstice. <i>The plant blooms in <b>midsummer</b>.</i>
<b>muggy</b>	Hot or warm and humid. <i><b>Muggy</b> weather.</i>
<b>scorching</b>	Capable of causing burns. <i><b>Scorching</b> heat.</i>
<b>season</b>	A proper or suitable time. <i>The regular sequence of the <b>seasons</b>.</i>
<b>smelt</b>	Extract a metal from ore by smelting. <i>Coal was used to <b>smelt</b> the steel for the tinsplate.</i>
<b>stifling</b>	Characterized by oppressive heat and humidity. <i>The loft is <b>stifling</b> in summer.</i>
<b>sultry</b>	Characterized by oppressive heat and humidity. <i>A <b>sultry</b> look.</i>
<b>summer</b>	The period from the summer solstice to the autumnal equinox. <i>We <b>summered</b> in Kashmir.</i>
<b>sunbathe</b>	Expose one's body to the sun. <i>I didn't do much apart from swim <b>sunbathe</b> and sleep.</i>
<b>sunstroke</b>	Heatstroke brought about by excessive exposure to the sun.

**swelter** Suffer from intense heat.  
*Barney **sweltered** in his doorman's uniform.*

**thermal** A thermal garment especially underwear.  
***Thermal** underwear.*

**thermoelectric** Involving or resulting from thermoelectricity.

**tropic** Either of two parallels of latitude about 23.5 degrees to the north and south of the equator representing the points farthest north and south at which the sun can shine directly overhead and constituting the boundaries of the Torrid Zone or tropics.  
***Tropical** weather.*

**vaporizer** A device that puts out a substance in the form of a vapor (especially for medicinal inhalation).

**warmed** Having been warmed up.  
*A cup of **warmed** milk.*
