fast	Firmly or closely. The ship was held <b>fast</b> by the anchor chain.
fleetly	In a swift manner.



immediately	In direct or very close relation. I rang <b>immediately</b> for an ambulance.
in a flash	To or toward the inside of.
in a trice	To or toward the inside of.
in an instant	To or toward the inside of.
in no time	To or toward the inside of.
in no time at all	To or toward the inside of.
in the wink of an eye	To or toward the inside of.
instantaneously	Without any delay. <i>Now we can communicate</i> <b>instantaneously</b> with the rest of the world.
<u>instantly</u>	Without any delay. She fell asleep almost <b>instantly</b> .
post-haste	As fast as possible; with all possible haste.
<u>promptly</u>	At exactly a specified time; punctually. <i>He <b>promptly</b> forgot the address.</i>
quickly	With speed. Reg s illness progressed frighteningly <b>quickly</b> .
rapidly	Very quickly; at a great rate. The problem is <b>rapidly</b> worsening.
speedily	With rapid movements. Your claim will be dealt with as <b>speedily</b> as possible.

### Usage Examples of "Swiftly" as an adverb

- They acted swiftly in response to the invasion.
- She got up and walked swiftly to the door.
- This comment was swiftly followed by an apology for such a poor choice of words.
- A swiftly flowing river.
- She moved swiftly.

# Associations of "Swiftly" (30 Words)

<u>abrupt</u>	Surprisingly and unceremoniously brusque in manner. <i>An <b>abrupt</b> canyon.</i>
briskness	Liveliness and eagerness.



fast	(of a sports field) likely to make the ball bounce or run quickly or to allow competitors to reach a high speed. <i>The journey was fast and enjoyable.</i>
<u>fleet</u>	A group of ships sailing together, engaged in the same activity, or under the same ownership. <i>Fleet</i> of foot.
hastily	In a hurried or hasty manner. <i>Hastily</i> he scanned the headlines.
hurried	Moving rapidly or performed quickly or in great haste. A <b>hurried</b> job.
hurriedly	In a hurried or hasty manner. He <b>hurriedly</b> packed his things and left.
hurry	A condition of urgency making it necessary to hurry. In a <b>hurry</b> to lock the door.
immediate	Immediately before or after as in a chain of cause and effect. The <b>immediate</b> cause of the trouble.
immediately	Without delay or hesitation; with no time intervening. <i>He answered <b>immediately</b>.</i>
instantaneous	Occurring or done instantly. <i>Relief was <b>instantaneous</b></i> .
<u>instantly</u>	Urgently or persistently. She fell asleep almost <b>instantly</b> .
overhasty	Excessively hasty. Rejected what was regarded as an <b>overhasty</b> plan for reconversion.
overrun	Invade in great numbers. <i>He allowed the match to <b>overrun</b> by 2 minutes.</i>
pressing	Expressing something strongly or persistently. <i>A</i> <b>pressing</b> <i>invitation</i> .
prompt	The time limit for the payment of an account stated on a prompt note. With barely a <b>prompt</b> Barbara talked on.
promptitude	The quality of acting quickly and without delay. <i>He arranges everything with extraordinary</i> <b>promptitude</b> <i>and foresight.</i>
<u>promptly</u>	At once (usually modifies an undesirable occurrence. <i>I won my appeal but instead of reinstating me they</i> <b>promptly</b> <i>sacked me again.</i>
quick	Moving quickly and lightly. Was <b>quick</b> to respond.



quickly	With speed. We moved <b>quickly</b> to deal with our auditor s questions.
<u>rapid</u>	A fast-flowing and turbulent part of the course of a river. They made a <b>rapid</b> exit.
rapidly	With speed. The business is expanding <b>rapidly</b> .
rush	Cause to move fast or to rush or race. Don t <b>rush</b> me please.
rushed	Done or completed too hurriedly; hasty. A <b>rushed</b> job.
scramble	Perform (an action) or achieve (a result) hurriedly, clumsily, or with difficulty. You may have your eggs <b>scramble</b> d or boiled.
speedily	With rapid movements. Your claim will be dealt with as <b>speedily</b> as possible.
<u>speeding</u>	Changing location rapidly.
<u>speedy</u>	Accomplished rapidly and without delay. Hoped for a <b>speedy</b> resolution of the problem.
suddenly	Happening unexpectedly. <b>Suddenly</b> she felt a sharp pain in her side.
<u>swift</u>	Swiftly. A <b>swift</b> runner.
