**naiant** Applied to a fish depicted horizontally.

<b>archery</b>	Shooting with a bow and arrows, especially at a target as a sport.
<b>badminton</b>	A game played on a court with light long-handled rackets used to volley a shuttlecock over a net.
<b>baseball</b>	A ball used in playing baseball. A <b>baseball</b> player.
<b>basketball</b>	The inflated ball used in basketball.
<b>bathing</b>	Immersing the body in water or sunshine.
<b>bowling</b>	The game of tenpin bowling. <i>On paper their <b>bowling</b> looks weak.</i>
<b>dive</b>	Swim under water. <i>She made a <b>dive</b> for the fridge to quench her thirst.</i>
<b>diving</b>	The sport or activity of diving into water from a diving board. <i>He scored with a <b>diving</b> header.</i>

<b>equestrian</b>	Relating to horse riding. <i>His amazing <b>equestrian</b> skills.</i>
<b>fencing</b>	The sport of fighting with swords, especially foils, épées, or sabres, according to a set of rules, in order to score points against an opponent. <i>A <b>fencing</b> foil.</i>
<b>golf</b>	Play golf. <i>He was a fixture at the <b>golf</b> club in Rockport where he <b>golfed</b> until his early nineties.</i>
<b>gymnastics</b>	Exercises developing or displaying physical agility and coordination The modern sport of gymnastics typically involves exercises on bars beam floor and vaulting horse. <i>These vocal <b>gymnastics</b> make the music unforgettable.</i>
<b>hockey</b>	A game resembling ice hockey that is played on an open field two opposing teams use curved sticks try to drive a ball into the opponents net.
<b>pool</b>	Something resembling a pool of liquid. <i>When he was first hired he was assigned to the <b>pool</b>.</i>
<b>puddle</b>	Make into a puddle. <i>He dug and <b>puddled</b> a large pond.</i>
<b>scuba</b>	Scuba diving. <i><b>Scuba</b> gear.</i>
<b>shoes</b>	A particular situation.
<b>skate</b>	Move on ice skates or roller skates in a gliding fashion. <i>Everyone was on <b>skates</b>.</i>
<b>soccer</b>	A football game in which two teams of 11 players try to kick or head a ball into the opponents' goal.
<b>sport</b>	Someone who engages in sports. <i>Team <b>sports</b> such as soccer and rugby.</i>
<b>sportive</b>	Playful; light-hearted. <i>Sir John was in <b>sportive</b> mood.</i>
<b>springboard</b>	A beginning from which an enterprise is launched. <i>He uses other people s ideas as a <b>springboard</b> for his own.</i>
<b>surfing</b>	The activity of moving from page to page or site to site on the World Wide Web. <i>Why share your internet connection with people <b>surfing</b> and chatting.</i>
<b>swim</b>	An act or period of swimming. <i>They took a short <b>swim</b> in the pool.</i>



- swimmer** A sperm cell.  
*He is not a good **swimmer**.*
- tennis** A game in which two or four players strike a ball with rackets over a net stretched across a court The usual form originally called lawn tennis is played with a felt covered hollow rubber ball on a grass clay or artificial surface.
- volleyball** The inflated ball used in volleyball.
- weightlifting** The sport or activity of lifting barbells or other heavy weights There are two standard lifts in modern weightlifting the single movement lift from floor to extended position the snatch and the two movement lift from floor to shoulder position and from shoulders to extended position the clean and jerk.
- wrestling** The act of engaging in close hand-to-hand combat.  
*We watched his grappling and **wrestling** with the bully.*
- writhe** To move in a twisting or contorted motion, (especially when struggling).  
*He **writhe**d in agony on the ground.*
