- *A spontaneous loss of consciousness caused by insufficient blood to the brain.*
- *An occurrence of fainting.*

Synonyms of "Swoon" as a noun (8 Words)

blackout

A period when all lights must be turned out or covered to prevent them being seen by the enemy during an air raid.

*The total information **blackout** on the series of meetings.*

deliquium

A spontaneous loss of consciousness caused by insufficient blood to the brain.

faint

A spontaneous loss of consciousness caused by insufficient blood to the brain.

*She hit the floor in a dead **faint**.*

fainting	A spontaneous loss of consciousness caused by insufficient blood to the brain.
fainting fit	A spontaneous loss of consciousness caused by insufficient blood to the brain.
loss of consciousness	The act of losing someone or something.
passing out	Success in satisfying a test or requirement.
syncope	(phonology) the loss of sounds from within a word (as in `fo`c`sle` for `forecastle).

Swoon as a Verb

Definitions of "Swoon" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "swoon" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Pass out from weakness, physical or emotional distress due to a loss of blood supply to the brain.*
- *Faint, especially from extreme emotion.*
- *Be overcome with admiration, adoration, or other strong emotion.*

Synonyms of "Swoon" as a verb (7 Words)

black out	Make or become black.
<u>collapse</u>	Collapse due to fatigue an illness or a sudden attack. <i>The roof collapsed on top of me.</i>
conk	(of a person) faint or go to sleep. <i>Most creatures conk out smartly once they have passed on their genes.</i>
<u>faint</u>	Pass out from weakness, physical or emotional distress due to a loss of blood supply to the brain. <i>I fainted from loss of blood.</i>
fall unconscious	Yield to temptation or sin.
lose consciousness	Allow to go out of sight.

pass out Transmit information.

Usage Examples of "Swoon" as a verb

- *Frankie's mother swooned and had to be helped to the headmaster's office.*
- *You can have them swooning over you with a few well-placed words.*
