- *A mark or character used as a conventional representation of an object, function, or process, e.g. the letter or letters standing for a chemical element or a character in musical notation.*
- *Something visible that by association or convention represents something else that is invisible.*

<b><u>emblem</u></b>	A heraldic device or symbolic object as a distinctive badge of a nation, organization, or family. <i>Our child would be a dazzling <b>emblem</b> of our love.</i>
<b>figure</b>	A combination of points and lines and planes that form a visible palpable shape. <i>Starkly painted <b>figures</b>.</i>
<b><u>flag</u></b>	The ensign carried by a flagship as an emblem of an admiral's rank. <i>He pledged allegiance to the <b>flag</b>.</i>
<b><u>hallmark</u></b>	A distinctive feature. <i>The tiny bubbles are the <b>hallmark</b> of fine champagnes.</i>
<b>hieroglyph</b>	Writing that resembles hieroglyphics usually by being illegible. <i>The International Organisation for Standardization is introducing two new <b>hieroglyphs</b> to perplex washing machine owners.</i>
<b>ideogram</b>	A character symbolizing the idea of a thing without indicating the sounds used to say it. Examples include numerals and Chinese characters. <i>Chinese characters are <b>ideograms</b>.</i>
<b><u>image</u></b>	The set of values of the dependent variable for which a function is defined. <i>He provided America with an <b>image</b> of the good father.</i>
<b>insignia</b>	A sign or token of something. <i>The ruins are devoid of moss and ivy the romantic <b>insignia</b> of age and decay.</i>
<b>letter</b>	An emblem in the shape of the initial letter of a school or university's name awarded to a student for achievement in sport. <i>We must keep the spirit of the law as well as the <b>letter</b>.</i>
<b><u>logo</u></b>	A symbol or other small design adopted by an organization to identify its products, uniform, vehicles, etc. <i>The Olympic <b>logo</b> was emblazoned across the tracksuits.</i>
<b>logogram</b>	A sign or character representing a word or phrase, such as those used in shorthand and some ancient writing systems. <i>7 is a <b>logogram</b> that is pronounced seven in English and nanatsu in Japanese.</i>
<b>logotype</b>	A single piece of type that prints a word, a group of separate letters, or a logo.
<b>mark</b>	A marking that consists of lines that cross each other. <i>He signed his <b>mark</b> in the visitor's book.</i>
<b>monogram</b>	A motif of two or more interwoven letters, typically a person's initials, used to identify a personal possession or as a logo. <i>A handkerchief with his <b>monogram</b> embroidered on one corner.</i>

<b>motif</b>	A leitmotif or figure. <i>In this opera Verdi used identifying <b>motifs</b>.</i>
<b>motto</b>	A phrase which recurs throughout a musical work and has some symbolical significance. <i>The family <b>motto</b> is Faithful though Unfortunate.</i>
<b>representation</b>	A picture, model, or other depiction of someone or something. <i>Certain <b>representations</b> were made concerning police brutality.</i>
<b>rune</b>	Any character from an ancient Germanic alphabet used in Scandinavia from the 3rd century to the Middle Ages. <i>The pommel and guard are embellished with <b>runes</b>.</i>
<b>seal</b>	The pelt or fur especially the underfur of a seal. <i>A coat of <b>seal</b>.</i>
<b>sign</b>	A fundamental linguistic unit linking a signifier to that which is signified. <i>The highway was lined with <b>signboards</b>.</i>
<b>stamp</b>	An act or sound of stamping with the foot. <i>TV licence <b>stamps</b>.</i>
<b>symbolisation</b>	The practice of investing things with symbolic meaning.
<b>symbolization</b>	Something visible that by association or convention represents something else that is invisible.
<b>tag</b>	The tip of an animal's tail when it is distinctively coloured. <i>His writing is full of <b>tags</b> from the Bible and Shakespeare.</i>
<b>token</b>	A sequence of bits passed continuously between nodes in a fixed order and enabling a node to transmit information. <i>The next black actor or actress selected won't know if it's because of their ability and performance or if they're just a <b>token</b>.</i>
<b>trademark</b>	A distinctive characteristic or attribute. <i>The murder had all the <b>trademarks</b> of a Mafia hit.</i>
<b>type</b>	Metal types used in letterpress printing. <i>The capable <b>type</b>.</i>

<b>exemplify</b>	Illustrate or clarify by giving an example. <i>The best dry sherry is exemplified by the fino of Jerez.</i>
<b>glyph</b>	A hieroglyphic character or symbol. <i>Flanges painted with esoteric <b>glyphs</b>.</i>
<b>heraldic</b>	Of or relating to heraldry. <i><b>Heraldic</b> devices.</i>
<b>indication</b>	A reason to prescribe a drug or perform a procedure. <i>The visit was an <b>indication</b> of the improvement in relations between the countries.</i>
