- Of or relating to the sympathetic nervous system.
- (of a person) attracting the liking of others.
- Showing approval of or favour towards an idea or action.
- Expressing or feeling or resulting from sympathy or compassion or friendly fellow feelings; disposed toward.
- Evoking empathic or sympathetic feelings.
- Showing or motivated by sympathy and understanding and generosity.
- Relating to or denoting the part of the autonomic nervous system consisting of nerves arising from ganglia near the middle part of the spinal cord, supplying the internal organs, blood vessels, and glands, and balancing the action of the parasympathetic



nerves.

- Having similar disposition and tastes.
- (of characters in literature or drama) evoking empathic or sympathetic feelings.
- Relating to, producing, or denoting an effect which arises in response to a similar action elsewhere.


