## Associations of "Symptoms" (30 Words)

<b>augur</b>	Indicate by signs. <i>The end of the cold war seemed to <b>augur</b> well.</i>
<b>bespeak</b>	Order or reserve (something) in advance. <i>The defendant's insurers took steps to <b>bespeak</b> his medical records.</i>
<b>betoken</b>	Be a signal for or a symptom of. <i>She wondered if his cold level gaze <b>betokened</b> indifference or anger.</i>
<b>bode</b>	Be a portent of a particular outcome. <i>These signs <b>bode</b> bad news.</i>
<b>boding</b>	A feeling of evil to come. <i>A steadily escalating sense of fore<b>boding</b>.</i>
<b>cue</b>	Give a cue to or for. <i>Ros and Guil <b>cued</b> by Hamlet also bow deeply.</i>
<b>foreshadow</b>	Indicate by signs. <i>Other new measures are <b>foreshadowed</b> in the White Paper.</i>
<b>foretell</b>	Indicate, as with a sign or an omen. <i>A seer had foretold that the earl would assume the throne.</i>
<b>hangover</b>	Disagreeable aftereffects from the use of drugs (especially alcohol). <i>This feeling of insecurity was in part a <b>hangover</b> from her schooldays.</i>
<b>hint</b>	Drop a hint intimate by a hint. <i>The restrained fronts of the terraced houses only <b>hinted</b> at the wealth within.</i>
<b>hypochondria</b>	Abnormal chronic anxiety about one's health.
<b><u>illness</u></b>	A disease or period of sickness affecting the body or mind. <i>I've never missed a day's work through <b>illness</b>.</i>
<b>indicant</b>	A thing which indicates something. <i>Symptoms are the prime <b>indicants</b> of disease.</i>

<b>indicate</b>	Indicate a place direction person or thing either spatially or figuratively. <i>These symptoms <b>indicate</b> a serious illness.</i>
<b>indication</b>	The act of indicating or pointing out by name. <i>The presence of bacterial infection was an <b>indication</b> for the use of antibiotics.</i>
<b>omen</b>	Indicate as with a sign or an omen. <i>He looked for an <b>omen</b> before going into battle.</i>
<b>palliation</b>	Easing the severity of a pain or a disease without removing the cause.
<b>portend</b>	Be a sign or warning that (something, especially something momentous or calamitous) is likely to happen. <i>The eclipses <b>portend</b> some major events.</i>
<b>portent</b>	A sign or warning that a momentous or calamitous event is likely to happen. <i>What <b>portent</b> can be greater than a pious notary.</i>
<b>predict</b>	Make a prediction about tell in advance. <i>He <b>predicts</b> that the trend will continue.</i>
<b>prefigure</b>	Be an early indication or version of (something). <i>It wasn't as bad as I had <b>prefigured</b>.</i>
<b>presage</b>	Be a sign or warning of (an imminent event, typically an unwelcome one). <i>The heavy clouds above the moorland <b>presaged</b> snow.</i>
<b>prognosticate</b>	Indicate by signs. <i>The economists were prognosticating financial Armageddon.</i>
<b>prognostication</b>	A statement made about the future. <i>These gloomy <b>prognostications</b> proved to be unfounded.</i>
<b><u>prophetic</u></b>	Foretelling events as if by supernatural intervention. <i><b>Prophetic</b> writings.</i>
<b>sign</b>	Commit oneself to work by signing a contract. <i>It was a <b>sign</b> from God.</i>
<b>signal</b>	Be a signal for or a symptom of. <i>The diner <b>signaled</b> the waiters to bring the menu.</i>
<b><u>symbol</u></b>	Symbolize. <i>The chemical <b>symbol</b> for helium is He.</i>
<b><u>symbolic</u></b>	Using symbolism. <i>Klimt's <b>symbolic</b> painting of 1900 7.</i>
<b>zodiac</b>	A representation of the signs of the zodiac or of a similar astrological system.
