<b>buddhism</b>	The teaching of Buddha that life is permeated with suffering caused by desire, that suffering ceases when desire ceases, and that enlightenment obtained through right conduct and wisdom and meditation releases one from desire and suffer.
<b>buddhist</b>	Of or relating to or supporting Buddhism.
<b>calvary</b>	A hill near Jerusalem where Jesus was crucified.

<b>confucian</b>	A believer in the teachings of Confucius.
<b>dedicated</b>	Solemnly dedicated to or set apart for a high purpose. <i>A chapel <b>dedicated</b> to the dead of World War II.</i>
<b>deist</b>	Of or relating to deism.
<b><u>devout</u></b>	Earnest. <i>The most <b>devout</b> environmentalist.</i>
<b>diaspora</b>	The dispersion or spreading of something that was originally localized (as a people or language or culture). <i>The <b>diaspora</b> of boat people from Asia.</i>
<b>holy</b>	Morally and spiritually excellent. <i>I do not lead a <b>holy</b> life.</i>
<b>homeland</b>	A person's or a people's native land. <i>He left his <b>homeland</b> to settle in London.</i>
<b>japanese</b>	Of or relating to or characteristic of Japan or its people or their culture or language.
<b>jewish</b>	Of or relating to Jews or their culture or religion.
<b>martyrdom</b>	Death that is imposed because of the person's adherence of a religious faith or cause. <i>The <b>martyrdom</b> of St Anthony.</i>
<b><u>monk</u></b>	A member of a religious community of men typically living under vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience.

<b>mosque</b>	(Islam) a Muslim place of worship that usually has a minaret.
<b>nelson</b>	A wrestling hold in which one arm is passed under the opponent's arm from behind and the hand is applied to the neck half nelson or both arms and hands are applied full nelson.
<b>pagoda</b>	An ornamental imitation of a Hindu or Buddhist pagoda.
<b><u>pilgrimage</u></b>	Go on a pilgrimage. <i>He wanted to go on a <b>pilgrimage</b> to Santiago de Compostela.</i>
<b><u>pious</u></b>	Devoutly religious. <i><b>Pious</b> readings.</i>
<b><u>prayer</u></b>	The act of communicating with a deity (especially as a petition or in adoration or contrition or thanksgiving). <i>The priest sank to his knees in <b>prayer</b>.</i>
<b><u>priest</u></b>	Ordain to the priesthood. <i>He was made deacon in 1990 and <b>priested</b> in 1994.</i>
<b>religious</b>	A member of a religious order who is bound by vows of poverty and chastity and obedience. <i><b>Religious</b> houses were built on ancient pagan sites.</i>
<b>saint</b>	Used in titles of religious saints. <i>Figures of apostles and <b>saints</b>.</i>
<b>saintly</b>	Very holy or virtuous. <i>A truly <b>saintly</b> woman.</i>
<b><u>shrine</u></b>	Enclose in a shrine. <i>Her grave has become a <b>shrine</b> for fans from all over the world.</i>
<b>temple</b>	A thing regarded as holy or likened to a temple especially a person's body. <i>A <b>temple</b> of science.</i>
