believing	The cognitive process that leads to convictions. <i>Seeing is believing.</i>
beth	The second letter of the Hebrew alphabet.
buddhism	The teaching of Buddha that life is permeated with suffering caused by desire, that suffering ceases when desire ceases, and that enlightenment obtained through right conduct and wisdom and meditation releases one from desire and suffer.
buddhist	Of or relating to or supporting Buddhism.
calvary	A hill near Jerusalem where Jesus was crucified.
church	Perform a special church rite or service for. <i>The church was largely rebuilt at the end of the 15th century.</i>
confucian	A believer in the teachings of Confucius.
dedicated	Solemnly dedicated to or set apart for a high purpose. <i>A chapel dedicated to the dead of World War II.</i>
deist	Of or relating to deism.
devout	Earnest. <i>The most devout environmentalist.</i>
diaspora	The dispersion or spreading of something that was originally localized (as a people or language or culture). <i>The diaspora of boat people from Asia.</i>
holy	Morally and spiritually excellent. <i>I do not lead a holy life.</i>
homeland	A person's or a people's native land. <i>He left his homeland to settle in London.</i>
japanese	Of or relating to or characteristic of Japan or its people or their culture or language.
jewish	Of or relating to Jews or their culture or religion.
martyrdom	Death that is imposed because of the person's adherence of a religious faith or cause. <i>The martyrdom of St Anthony.</i>
monk	A member of a religious community of men typically living under vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience.

mosque	(Islam) a Muslim place of worship that usually has a minaret.
nelson	A wrestling hold in which one arm is passed under the opponent's arm from behind and the hand is applied to the neck half nelson or both arms and hands are applied full nelson.
pagoda	An ornamental imitation of a Hindu or Buddhist pagoda.
<u>pilgrimage</u>	Go on a pilgrimage. <i>He wanted to go on a pilgrimage to Santiago de Compostela.</i>
<u>pious</u>	Devoutly religious. <i>Pious readings.</i>
<u>prayer</u>	The act of communicating with a deity (especially as a petition or in adoration or contrition or thanksgiving). <i>The priest sank to his knees in prayer.</i>
<u>priest</u>	Ordain to the priesthood. <i>He was made deacon in 1990 and priested in 1994.</i>
religious	A member of a religious order who is bound by vows of poverty and chastity and obedience. <i>Religious houses were built on ancient pagan sites.</i>
saint	Used in titles of religious saints. <i>Figures of apostles and saints.</i>
saintly	Very holy or virtuous. <i>A truly saintly woman.</i>
<u>shrine</u>	Enclose in a shrine. <i>Her grave has become a shrine for fans from all over the world.</i>
temple	A thing regarded as holy or likened to a temple especially a person's body. <i>A temple of science.</i>
