## **Sync as a Verb**

### **Definitions of "Sync" as a verb**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “sync” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Synchronize.*
- *Make synchronous and adjust in time or manner.*



## Synonyms of "Sync" as a verb (2 Words)

**synchronise** Happen at the same time.

Cause to indicate the same time or rate.

**synchronize** You can **synchronize** your calendar with your GPS device and be alerted when you need to leave for an appointment.

- *The flash needs to be synced to your camera.*

<b>activate</b>	Make (something) active or operative. <i>A DNA repair enzyme that is <b>activated</b> by visible light.</i>
<b>automatically</b>	In a mechanical manner; by a mechanism. <i>The winners of the Division 2 final are not <b>automatically</b> promoted.</i>
<b>coexisting</b>	Existing at the same time.
<b><u>coincide</u></b>	Occur at the same time. <i>The two events <b>coincided</b>.</i>
<b><u>coincidence</u></b>	The quality of occupying the same position or area in space. <i>The interval determining the <b>coincidence</b> gate is adjustable.</i>
<b>coincident</b>	Occurring or operating at the same time. <i>A series of <b>coincident</b> events.</i>
<b><u>coincidental</u></b>	Happening or existing at the same time. <i>It s convenient that his plan is <b>coincidental</b> with the group s closure.</i>

<b><u>concomitant</u></b>	Naturally accompanying or associated. <i><b>Concomitant</b> with his obsession with dirt was a desire for order.</i>
<b>concurrent</b>	Occurring or operating at the same time. <i>There are three <b>concurrent</b> art fairs around the city.</i>
<b>concurrently</b>	Overlapping in duration. <i>Journal articles published <b>concurrently</b> with the exhibition.</i>
<b><u>congruent</u></b>	(of figures) identical in form; coinciding exactly when superimposed. <i>Institutional and departmental objectives are very largely <b>congruent</b>.</i>
<b><u>contemporaneous</u></b>	Occurring in the same period of time. <i>Pythagoras was <b>contemporaneous</b> with Buddha.</i>
<b><u>contemporary</u></b>	Characteristic of the present. <i>He was a <b>contemporary</b> of Darwin.</i>
<b>cooperation</b>	The formation and operation of cooperatives. <i>Their <b>cooperation</b> with us was essential for the success of our mission.</i>
<b><u>cooperative</u></b>	An association formed and operated for the benefit of those using it. <i>They have been extremely considerate polite and <b>cooperative</b>.</i>
<b>enroll</b>	Register formally as a participant or member.
<b><u>equalize</u></b>	Become equal to a specified or standard level. <i>Britain is required to <b>equalize</b> pension rights between men and women.</i>
<b><u>equate</u></b>	Cause (two or more things) to be the same in quantity or value. <i>Customers <b>equate</b> their name with quality.</i>
<b>hap</b>	An accidental happening. <i>What is <b>happening</b>.</i>
<b><u>identical</u></b>	Being the exact same one; not any other. <i><b>Identical</b> triangles.</i>
<b>incidentally</b>	Introducing a different topic. <i><b>Incidentally</b> I won't go to the party.</i>
<b>liken</b>	Point out the resemblance of someone or something to. <i>Racism is <b>likened</b> to a contagious disease.</i>
<b>occur</b>	Exist or be found to be present in a place or under a particular set of conditions. <i>Sexism <b>occurs</b> in many workplaces.</i>
<b>same</b>	Same in identity. <i>Two boxes having the <b>same</b> dimensions.</i>

- simultaneous** Occurring or operating at the same time.  
*A **simultaneous** withdrawal of troops.*
- simultaneously** At the same instant.  
*It works **simultaneously** as character study teen drama and sci fi thriller.*
- synchronism** The relation that exists when things occur at the same time.
- synchronize** Cause to indicate the same time or rate.  
*The clocks **synchronize**.*
- synchronous** Making or denoting an orbit around the earth or another celestial body in which one revolution is completed in the period taken for the body to rotate about its axis.  
*Glaciations were approximately **synchronous** in both hemispheres.*
- together** At the same time.  
*Mix **together** the soya sauce and sesame oil.*
