coeval	A person of roughly the same age as oneself; a contemporary. Like so many of his coeval s he yearned for stability.
coexisting	Existing at the same time.
<u>coincide</u>	Be the same. Publication is timed to coincide with a major exhibition.
<u>coincidence</u>	The quality of occupying the same position or area in space. They met by coincidence .
coincident	Occurring or operating at the same time. The stake of defence attorneys is not always coincident with that of their clients.
<u>coincidental</u>	Happening or existing at the same time. <i>Any resemblance between their reports is purely</i> coincidental .



<u>concomitant</u>	Naturally accompanying or associated. Concomitant with his obsession with dirt was a desire for order.
concurrent	Occurring or operating at the same time. She was given nine months concurrent for each offence.
concurrently	Overlapping in duration. Journal articles published concurrently with the exhibition.
<u>contemporaneous</u>	Existing at or occurring in the same period of time. A rise in interest rates is often contemporaneous with an increase in inflation.
<u>contemporary</u>	A person of roughly the same age as another. This series of paintings is contemporary with other works in an early style.
<u>cooperative</u>	An association formed and operated for the benefit of those using it. Every member has clearly defined tasks in a cooperative enterprise.
<u>equalize</u>	Compensate; make the score equal. Morgan equalize d ten minutes into the second half.
<u>equate</u>	(of one thing) be the same as or equivalent to (another. <i>Customers</i> equate their name with quality.
<u>identical</u>	(of twins) derived from a single egg or ovum. Cars identical except for their license plates.
<u>latest</u>	The most recent news or fashion. The very latest scientific discoveries.
liken	Consider or describe as similar, equal, or analogous. Racism is liken ed to a contagious disease.
<u>modern</u>	Belonging to the modern era since the Middle Ages. They were modern s they must not look back towards the old generation.
now	Used to preface a command or reproof or request. It is solely by their language that the upper classes now adays are distinguished.
oscillate	Be undecided about something; waver between conflicting positions or courses of action. The grain pan near the front of the combine oscillate s back and forth.
recent	The Holocene epoch. Recent buds on the apple trees.
recently	At a recent time; not long ago. <i>He was in Paris recently.</i>



same	Similarly in the same way. I m the same age as you are.
<u>simultaneous</u>	Occurring, operating, or done at the same time. A simultaneous withdrawal of troops.
simultaneously	At the same instant. The telethon was broadcast simultaneously on 31 US networks.
<u>sync</u>	Synchronization. Images flash on to your screen in sync with the music.
synchronism	The relation that exists when things occur at the same time.
synchronous	Existing or occurring at the same time. <i>Glaciations were approximately</i> synchronous in both hemispheres.
timing	The regulation of occurrence, pace, or coordination to achieve a desired effect (as in music, theater, athletics, mechanics. <i>The introduction of new signal timings</i> .
