automatically	(with reference to a firearm) continuously until the ammunition is exhausted or the pressure on the trigger is released. <i>The recovered weapons had been illegally modified to fire fully automatically.</i>
coeval	A person of roughly the same age as oneself; a contemporary. <i>Like so many of his coevals he yearned for stability.</i>
coexisting	Existing at the same time.
<u>coincide</u>	Be the same. <i>Publication is timed to coincide with a major exhibition.</i>
<u>coincidence</u>	The quality of occupying the same position or area in space. <i>They met by coincidence.</i>
coincident	Occurring or operating at the same time. <i>The stake of defence attorneys is not always coincident with that of their clients.</i>
<u>coincidental</u>	Happening or existing at the same time. <i>Any resemblance between their reports is purely coincidental.</i>

<u>concomitant</u>	Naturally accompanying or associated. <i>Concomitant with his obsession with dirt was a desire for order.</i>
concurrent	Occurring or operating at the same time. <i>She was given nine months concurrent for each offence.</i>
concurrently	Overlapping in duration. <i>Journal articles published concurrently with the exhibition.</i>
<u>contemporaneous</u>	Existing at or occurring in the same period of time. <i>A rise in interest rates is often contemporaneous with an increase in inflation.</i>
<u>contemporary</u>	A person of roughly the same age as another. <i>This series of paintings is contemporary with other works in an early style.</i>
<u>cooperative</u>	An association formed and operated for the benefit of those using it. <i>Every member has clearly defined tasks in a cooperative enterprise.</i>
<u>equalize</u>	Compensate; make the score equal. <i>Morgan equalized ten minutes into the second half.</i>
<u>equate</u>	(of one thing) be the same as or equivalent to (another). <i>Customers equate their name with quality.</i>
<u>identical</u>	(of twins) derived from a single egg or ovum. <i>Cars identical except for their license plates.</i>
<u>latest</u>	The most recent news or fashion. <i>The very latest scientific discoveries.</i>
liken	Consider or describe as similar, equal, or analogous. <i>Racism is likened to a contagious disease.</i>
<u>modern</u>	Belonging to the modern era since the Middle Ages. <i>They were moderns they must not look back towards the old generation.</i>
now	Used to preface a command or reproof or request. <i>It is solely by their language that the upper classes nowadays are distinguished.</i>
oscillate	Be undecided about something; waver between conflicting positions or courses of action. <i>The grain pan near the front of the combine oscillates back and forth.</i>
recent	The Holocene epoch. <i>Recent buds on the apple trees.</i>
recently	At a recent time; not long ago. <i>He was in Paris recently.</i>

same	Similarly in the same way. <i>I m the same age as you are.</i>
<u>simultaneous</u>	Occurring, operating, or done at the same time. <i>A simultaneous withdrawal of troops.</i>
simultaneously	At the same instant. <i>The telethon was broadcast simultaneously on 31 US networks.</i>
<u>sync</u>	Synchronization. <i>Images flash on to your screen in sync with the music.</i>
synchronism	The relation that exists when things occur at the same time.
synchronous	Existing or occurring at the same time. <i>Glaciations were approximately synchronous in both hemispheres.</i>
timing	The regulation of occurrence, pace, or coordination to achieve a desired effect (as in music, theater, athletics, mechanics). <i>The introduction of new signal timings.</i>
