Associations of "Synonym for identify" (30 Words)

akin	Of similar character. <i>Something akin to gratitude overwhelmed her.</i>
alike	In a like manner. <i>They looked utterly alike.</i>
analogous	(of organs) performing a similar function but having a different evolutionary origin, such as the wings of insects and birds. <i>The wings of a bee and those of a hummingbird are analogous.</i>
as	To the same degree often followed by as. <i>It tasted like grape juice but not as sweet.</i>
assort	Keep company with; hang out with. <i>Banding on the shell assorts independently of colour.</i>
categorize	Place in a particular class or group. <i>Silk is categorized as a luxury import.</i>
classify	Assign to a class or kind. <i>How would you classify these pottery shards are they prehistoric.</i>
comparable	Conforming in every respect. <i>Nobody is comparable with this athlete.</i>
compare	Be comparable. <i>We compared notes after we had both seen the movie.</i>
congruent	In agreement or harmony. <i>Institutional and departmental objectives are very largely congruent.</i>
distinguish	Be a distinctive feature, attribute, or trait; sometimes in a very positive sense. <i>The child is perfectly capable of distinguishing reality from fantasy.</i>
ditto	The same thing again used in lists and accounts and often indicated by a ditto mark under the word or figure to be repeated. <i>If one folds his arms so does the other if one crosses his legs ditto.</i>

equal	Make equal uniform corresponding or matching. <i>All men are equal before the law.</i>
equally	In addition and having the same importance (used to introduce a further comment). <i>Deal equally with rich and poor.</i>
equivalent	Equal in value, amount, function, meaning, etc. <i>The French equivalent of the Bank of England.</i>
evenhanded	Without partiality. <i>Evenhanded justice.</i>
homogeneous	Of the same kind; alike. <i>A close knit homogeneous group.</i>
identical	(of something encountered on separate occasions) the same. <i>She stole a suitcase from the identical station at which she had been arrested before.</i>
indistinguishable	Not able to be identified as different or distinct. <i>The twins were indistinguishable.</i>
isochronous	Occurring at the same time.
liken	Consider or describe as similar, equal, or analogous. <i>Racism is likened to a contagious disease.</i>
likeness	A portrait or representation. <i>A family likeness can be seen in all the boys.</i>
proportionate	Exhibiting equivalence or correspondence among constituents of an entity or between different entities. <i>Proportionate representation of a minority group.</i>
recognized	Generally approved or compelling recognition. <i>A recognized authority.</i>
resemblance	A way in which two or more things are alike. <i>The physical resemblances between humans and apes.</i>
same	Same in identity. <i>His attitude is the same as ever.</i>
separate	Separate into parts or portions. <i>The couple separated after 25 years of marriage.</i>
similitude	A duplicate copy. <i>Conrad uses a range of constructions which express or imply similitude.</i>
tantamount	Being essentially equal to something. <i>His statement was tantamount to an admission of guilt.</i>
