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## Associations of "Synonym for identify" (30 Words)

<a href="#">akin</a>	Of similar character. <i>Something <b>akin</b> to gratitude overwhelmed her.</i>
<b>alike</b>	In a like manner. <i>They looked utterly <b>alike</b>.</i>
<a href="#">analogous</a>	(of organs) performing a similar function but having a different evolutionary origin, such as the wings of insects and birds. <i>The wings of a bee and those of a hummingbird are <b>analogous</b>.</i>
<b>as</b>	To the same degree often followed by as. <i>It <b>tasted</b> like grape juice but not <b>as</b> sweet.</i>
<b>assort</b>	Keep company with; hang out with. <i>Banding on the shell <b>assorts</b> independently of colour.</i>
<b>categorize</b>	Place in a particular class or group. <i>Silk is <b>categorized</b> as a luxury import.</i>
<a href="#">classify</a>	Assign to a class or kind. <i>How would you <b>classify</b> these pottery shards are they prehistoric.</i>
<a href="#">comparable</a>	Conforming in every respect. <i>Nobody is <b>comparable</b> with this athlete.</i>
<b>compare</b>	Be comparable. <i>We <b>compared</b> notes after we had both seen the movie.</i>
<a href="#">congruent</a>	In agreement or harmony. <i>Institutional and departmental objectives are very largely <b>congruent</b>.</i>
<a href="#">distinguish</a>	Be a distinctive feature, attribute, or trait; sometimes in a very positive sense. <i>The child is perfectly capable of <b>distinguishing</b> reality from fantasy.</i>
<a href="#">ditto</a>	The same thing again used in lists and accounts and often indicated by a ditto mark under the word or figure to be repeated. <i>If one folds his arms so does the other if one crosses his legs <b>ditto</b>.</i>

<b>equal</b>	Make equal uniform corresponding or matching. <i>All men are <b>equal</b> before the law.</i>
<b>equally</b>	In addition and having the same importance (used to introduce a further comment). <i>Deal <b>equally</b> with rich and poor.</i>
<b>equivalent</b>	Equal in value, amount, function, meaning, etc. <i>The French <b>equivalent</b> of the Bank of England.</i>
<b>evenhanded</b>	Without partiality. <i><b>Evenhanded</b> justice.</i>
<b>homogeneous</b>	Of the same kind; alike. <i>A close knit <b>homogeneous</b> group.</i>
<b>identical</b>	(of something encountered on separate occasions) the same. <i>She stole a suitcase from the <b>identical</b> station at which she had been arrested before.</i>
<b>indistinguishable</b>	Not able to be identified as different or distinct. <i>The twins were <b>indistinguishable</b>.</i>
<b>isochronous</b>	Occurring at the same time.
<b>liken</b>	Consider or describe as similar, equal, or analogous. <i>Racism is <b>likened</b> to a contagious disease.</i>
<b>likeness</b>	A portrait or representation. <i>A family <b>likeness</b> can be seen in all the boys.</i>
<b>proportionate</b>	Exhibiting equivalence or correspondence among constituents of an entity or between different entities. <i><b>Proportionate</b> representation of a minority group.</i>
<b>recognized</b>	Generally approved or compelling recognition. <i>A <b>recognized</b> authority.</i>
<b>resemblance</b>	A way in which two or more things are alike. <i>The physical <b>resemblances</b> between humans and apes.</i>
<b>same</b>	Same in identity. <i>His attitude is the <b>same</b> as ever.</i>
<b>separate</b>	Separate into parts or portions. <i>The couple <b>separated</b> after 25 years of marriage.</i>
<b>similitude</b>	A duplicate copy. <i>Conrad uses a range of constructions which express or imply <b>similitude</b>.</i>
<b>tantamount</b>	Being essentially equal to something. <i>His statement was <b>tantamount</b> to an admission of guilt.</i>
