<b>macroscopic</b>	Visible to the naked eye; not microscopic.
<b>microscopy</b>	Research with the use of microscopes.
<b>observant</b>	Quick to notice or perceive things. <i><b>Observant</b> of the speed limit.</i>
<b>observation</b>	The ability to notice things, especially significant details. <i>His powers of <b>observation</b>.</i>
<b>observatory</b>	A room or building housing an astronomical telescope or other scientific equipment for the study of natural phenomena.
<a href="#">observe</a>	Observe with care or pay close attention to. <i>A minute s silence will be <b>observed</b>.</i>

<b>observer</b>	A person trained to spot and identify enemy aircraft or to reconnoitre enemy positions from the air. <i>Elections scrutinized by international <b>observers</b>.</i>
<b>observing</b>	Quick to notice; showing quick and keen perception.
<b>optical</b>	A pair of glasses. <b>Optical</b> illusions.
<b>percipient</b>	Having good insight or understanding; perceptive. <i>He is a <b>percipient</b> interpreter of the public mood.</i>
<b>phantasm</b>	An illusory likeness of something. <i>The cart seemed to glide like a terrible <b>phantasm</b>.</i>
<b>sight</b>	Take aim by looking through the sights of a gun or other device. <i>In his <b>sight</b> she could do no wrong.</i>
<b>spectacle</b>	A blunder that makes you look ridiculous used in the phrase make a spectacle of yourself. <i>The <b>spectacle</b> of a city's mass grief.</i>
<a href="#"><u>spectator</u></a>	A close observer; someone who looks at something (such as an exhibition of some kind). <i>Around fifteen thousand <b>spectators</b> came to watch the thrills and spills.</i>
<b>telescope</b>	Make smaller or shorter. <i>The novel was <b>telescoped</b> into a short play.</i>
<b>telescopic</b>	Relating to or made with a telescope. <b>Telescopic</b> observations.
<b>viewer</b>	A device for looking at film transparencies or similar photographic images. <i>A slide <b>viewer</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>visibility</u></a>	The degree to which something has attracted general attention; prominence. <i>Low <b>visibility</b> caused by fog.</i>
<a href="#"><u>visible</u></a>	Visible imports or exports. <i>Mountains <b>visible</b> in the distance.</i>
