beholder	A person who sees or observes someone or something. <i>The building and landscape can elicit imaginative responses from the beholder.</i>
discovered	Discovered or determined by scientific observation. <i>The discovered behavior norms.</i>
experimenter	A person who tries out new ideas, methods, or activities. <i>Early experimenters with structure and harmony.</i>
eye	A thing resembling an eye in appearance shape or relative position. <i>He has an artist s eye.</i>
find	Make a discovery make a new finding. <i>He s still struggling to find the money for the trip.</i>
look	Look forward to the probable occurrence of. <i>Poirot looked a question.</i>
lookout	A place from which to keep watch or view the landscape. <i>A lookout point with breathtaking views.</i>
macroscopic	Visible to the naked eye; not microscopic.
microscopy	Research with the use of microscopes.
observant	Quick to notice or perceive things. <i>Observant of the speed limit.</i>
observation	The ability to notice things, especially significant details. <i>His powers of observation.</i>
observatory	A room or building housing an astronomical telescope or other scientific equipment for the study of natural phenomena.
observe	Observe with care or pay close attention to. <i>A minute s silence will be observed.</i>

observer	A person trained to spot and identify enemy aircraft or to reconnoitre enemy positions from the air. <i>Elections scrutinized by international observers.</i>
observing	Quick to notice; showing quick and keen perception.
optical	A pair of glasses. <i>Optical illusions.</i>
percipient	Having good insight or understanding; perceptive. <i>He is a percipient interpreter of the public mood.</i>
phantasm	An illusory likeness of something. <i>The cart seemed to glide like a terrible phantasm.</i>
sight	Take aim by looking through the sights of a gun or other device. <i>In his sight she could do no wrong.</i>
spectacle	A blunder that makes you look ridiculous used in the phrase make a spectacle of yourself. <i>The spectacle of a city's mass grief.</i>
<u>spectator</u>	A close observer; someone who looks at something (such as an exhibition of some kind). <i>Around fifteen thousand spectators came to watch the thrills and spills.</i>
telescope	Make smaller or shorter. <i>The novel was telescoped into a short play.</i>
telescopic	Relating to or made with a telescope. <i>Telescopic observations.</i>
viewer	A device for looking at film transparencies or similar photographic images. <i>A slide viewer.</i>
<u>visibility</u>	The degree to which something has attracted general attention; prominence. <i>Low visibility caused by fog.</i>
<u>visible</u>	Visible imports or exports. <i>Mountains visible in the distance.</i>
<u>visual</u>	Visible- Shakespeare. <i>Visual powers.</i>
<u>watch</u>	The officers and crew on duty during a watch. <i>They watched as the murderer was executed.</i>
witness	Be a witness to. <i>I was witness to one of the most amazing comebacks in sprinting history.</i>
