farther	To or at a greater extent or degree or a more advanced stage further is used more often than farther in this abstract sense. <i>Farther down the corridor.</i>
hence	From that fact or reason or as a result used to introduce a logical conclusion hence adv from this place. <i>Hence be gone.</i>

henceforth	From this or that time on. <i>Henceforth she will be known as Mrs Smith.</i>
hereby	(formal) by means of this. <i>All such warranties are hereby excluded.</i>
hitherto	Until now or until the point in time under discussion. <i>Hitherto part of French West Africa Benin achieved independence in 1960.</i>
later	At some eventual time in the future. <i>He s going to the store but he ll be back here later.</i>
pluperfect	The pluperfect tense. <i>He spoke with pluperfect precision.</i>
really	Used as intensifiers real is sometimes used informally for really rattling is informal. <i>I really want to go.</i>
shortly	In a short time; soon. <i>The new database will shortly be available for consultation.</i>
so	Used to introduce a logical conclusion from that fact or reason or as a result. <i>Help without which he would not have done so well.</i>
sometime	Former. <i>You must come and have supper sometime.</i>
subsequence	The state of following something, especially as a result or effect. <i>An affair which appeared in due subsequence in the newspapers.</i>
subsequently	Happening at a time subsequent to a reference time. <i>The officer decided to stop and subsequently made an arrest.</i>
terribly	In a terrible manner. <i>She sings terribly.</i>
then	At that time. <i>Well that s okay then.</i>
there	To or toward that place; away from the speaker. <i>You can take it from there.</i>
thereby	By that means; as a result of that. <i>Students perform in hospitals thereby gaining a deeper awareness of the therapeutic power of music.</i>
thereof	From that circumstance or source. <i>The member state or a part thereof.</i>
