### Definitions of "Synopsis" as a noun

- *A brief summary or general survey of something.*
- *An outline of the plot of a play, film, or book.*
- *A sketchy summary of the main points of an argument or theory.*

### Synonyms of "Synopsis" as a noun (13 Words)

<b>abridgement</b>	Curtailement of rights. <i>An <b>abridgement</b> of Shakespeare s Henry VI.</i>
<b>abstract</b>	An abstract work of art. <i>He loved her only in the <b>abstract</b> not in person.</i>
<b>compendium</b>	A publication containing a variety of works. <i>A <b>compendium</b> of tools.</i>
<b>condensation</b>	A concise version of something, especially a text. <i>A readable <b>condensation</b> of the recent literature.</i>

<b>digest</b>	A substance or mixture obtained by digestion. <i>A <b>digest</b> of their findings.</i>
<b>outline</b>	The contours or bounds of an object. <i>The chalked <b>outline</b> of a human body.</i>
<b>precis</b>	A summary or abstract of a text or speech.
<b>review</b>	A report on or evaluation of a subject or past events. <i>A <b>review</b> of her sentence.</i>
<b>rundown</b>	An analysis or summary of something by a knowledgeable person. <i>He gave his teammates a <b>rundown</b> on the opposition.</i>
<b>résumé</b>	Short descriptive summary (of events).
<b>sketch</b>	A humorous or satirical drawing published in a newspaper or magazine. <i>A hilarious <b>sketch</b> for their latest BBC series.</i>
<b>summarization</b>	The act of preparing a summary (or an instance thereof); stating briefly and succinctly.
<b>summary</b>	A brief statement or account of the main points of something. <i>He gave a <b>summary</b> of the conclusions.</i>

## Usage Examples of "Synopsis" as a noun

## Associations of "Synopsis" (30 Words)

<b>abbreviate</b>	Shorten (a word, phrase, or text). <i>I decided to <b>abbreviate</b> my stay in Cambridge.</i>
<b>abbreviated</b>	Cut short in duration. <i>The <b>abbreviated</b> speech.</i>
<b>abridge</b>	Lessen, diminish, or curtail. <i>The new law might <b>abridge</b> our freedom of expression.</i>
<b>abridgment</b>	A shortened version of a written work.
<b>abstract</b>	An abstract work of art. <i>The novel was too <b>abstract</b> and esoteric to sustain much attention.</i>
<b>cartography</b>	The science or practice of drawing maps.
<b>chart</b>	Make a chart of. <i>The record will probably <b>chart</b> at about No 74.</i>
<b>compendium</b>	A collection or set of similar items. <i>A <b>compendium</b> of tools.</i>

<b>condensation</b>	A reaction in which two molecules combine to form a larger molecule, producing a small molecule such as H <sub>2</sub> O as a by-product. <i>The cloud is caused by <b>condensation</b> in the air.</i>
<b>contour</b>	Mark a map or diagram with contour lines. <i>The road <b>contours</b> the hillside.</i>
<b>delineate</b>	Indicate the exact position of (a border or boundary). <i>His finger found a precisely outlined section <b>delineated</b> in red marker.</i>
<b>denouement</b>	The final resolution of the main complication of a literary or dramatic work. <i>I waited by the eighteenth green to see the <b>denouement</b>.</i>
<b>diagram</b>	Schedule the operations of a locomotive or train according to a diagram. <i>A <b>diagram</b> of the living room.</i>
<b>doodle</b>	Make a doodle draw aimlessly. <i>The text was interspersed with <b>doodles</b>.</i>
<b>draft</b>	Select a player for a sports team through the draft. <i>The White Sox chose him in the 13th round of the 1990 <b>draft</b>.</i>
<b>drawing</b>	The act of moving a load by drawing or pulling. <i>A series of charcoal <b>drawings</b> on white paper.</i>
<b>encapsulate</b>	Enclose (something) in or as if in a capsule. <i>Pancreatic tumours are <b>encapsulated</b> in a densely packed thicket of proteins and cells.</i>
<b>machination</b>	A plot or scheme.
<b>outline</b>	Draw up an outline or sketch for something. <i>The chalked <b>outline</b> of a human body.</i>
<b>plan</b>	A drawing or diagram made by projection on a horizontal plane especially one showing the layout of a building or one floor of a building. <i>The rebels had <b>planned</b> turmoil and confusion.</i>
<b>plot</b>	A graph showing the relation between two variables. <i>They concocted a <b>plot</b> to discredit the governor.</i>
<b>precis</b>	Make a precis of a text or speech.
<b>profile</b>	Represent in profile by drawing or painting. <i>A biochemical <b>profile</b> of blood.</i>
<b>prospectus</b>	A catalog listing the courses offered by a college or university. <i>A <b>prospectus</b> should contain the facts that an investor needs to make an informed decision.</i>
<b>recapitulate</b>	Summarize briefly. <i>Let s <b>recapitulate</b> the main ideas.</i>

**resume**

A summary of your academic and work history.

*The painting **resumed** its old condition when we restored it.*

**sketch**

Make a sketch of.

*He **sketched** a graceful bow in her direction.*

**summarize**

Give a brief statement of the main points of (something).

*These results can be **summarized** in the following table.*

**summary**

(of a conviction) made by a judge or magistrate without a jury.

*He gave a **summary** of the conclusions.*

**vignette**

Portray someone in the style of a vignette.

*A classic **vignette** of embassy life.*
